

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Article I. This Corporation has been organized to operate exclusively for charitable purposes, including but not limited to:

Section 1. The Providing Safe Passage client concerned agenda is to provide:

- food
- individual parent/child shelter,
- transportation,
- individual mentoring,
- childcare,
- personal amenities, and
- self-development workshops

to those:

- ◆ adult orphans,
- ◆ single parents,
- ◆ battered spouses, and
- ◆ trauma victims

who:

- ❖ agree to meet the following program requirements.

The requirements are to:

- ✓ enroll in and maintain perfect attendance at an institution of higher learning or vocational school,
- ✓ perform ten hours of company arranged community service per week, and
- ✓ attend three one-hour sessions of nondenominational religious studies per week.

Our goal is to develop successful entrepreneurs and community leaders from the ranks of the abused and disadvantaged who are caught in degenerative, inhumane generational cycles, by supporting their company required school and self-development efforts with direct services. Our role is to provide a comprehensive program that enables self-development in our clients, to monitor clients for program compliance, and to monitor staff for human resources policy compliance. The role of the client is, through program compliance, to demonstrate due diligence toward self-development.

Section 2. The Providing Safe Passage employee concerned agenda is to provide an equal distribution of work, family and community time for employees as part of the corporate culture. This is to be done by limiting the direct service employees from overtime, and requiring administrative executives to perform their work within a fifty-hour workweek; part of which is to be spent at home (as arranged individually with Human Resources). All employees are to receive one paid hour of lunch per workday, and free on-property daycare when a facility is available. Employees are to have one-day minimum off per week, scheduled consistently, in advance. The above policies are to protect the human need of its employees to recreate and rest.

Additionally, as a corporate acknowledgement of the human need to plan and assess, employees will be scheduled for and compensated for one workday per month performing on-property position assessment and planning. At the end of an employee planning day, during which the employee is relieved of regular duty, and which may include company scheduled training; the employee is to submit a brief entry for filing in the confidential employee emotions and analysis log. Brief entry is subject to employee interpretation.

We will accomplish our mission and purposes by:

1. Raising the necessary funds from contributors,
2. Allocating monies effectively,
3. Maintaining a human-paced and results-oriented corporate culture, and
4. Maintaining an effective self-development program for clients.

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
