### **PURPOSE**

#### Program Development:

- 1. To establish an economic development program which will assist veterans to a small business and aiding those veterans already in business to forge ahead as they desire with counseling, guidance, loans, etc.
- 2. To develop a program that deals with social problems for the youth, adults, and handicapped veterans in recreation and entertainment.
- To build a housing development specially designed for veterans who are barrier-prone handicapped along with paraplegics and amputees, to get them out of hospitals and reunited with their families and back in society.
- 4. To establish a Veteran's Credit Union on the local community level.
- 5. To introduce a "purpose bill", to the Veteran's Administration that will enable a veteran receiving a pension check to use half of his check as a means of collateral when trying to secure a bank loan.
- 6. To establish a program that will create jobs and employment through the United Veterans for Freedom, Inc. which will assist veterans in finding gainful employment with companies and the business industry.
- 7. To establish a special rehabilitation program for ex-offenders returning from prison into society by the use of half-way houses and establishing a rehabilitative program for persons who have committed minor offenses as an option to being on probation and/or incarcerated.
- 8. To utilize all methods available to seek qualified veterans in all fields through feasibility studies and random samplings which survey the de mographics on the status of veterans and their locations.

- 9. To establish a training program for the Community-at-large which will develop a working together attitude in the local community.
- 10. To give the people in the community a basic understanding of the proper and most acceptable leadership by using persuasive methods to motivate and build their morale around constructive programs, that will help develop their local community environment.
- 11. To develop programs through out community leadership program that will, over a period of time, eliminate some of the problems of unrest that are encountered at the local neighborhood or community level such as crime in the streets, drugs, etc.
