ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

For

South Florida Arts Opportunities Center, Inc.

Articles of Incorporation of the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Corporation under the Non-Profit Corporation laws pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, do hearby certify:

First: The name of the Corporation shall be South Florida Arts Opportunities Center, Inc.

Second: The place in this state where the principal office of the Corporation is to be located is in the County of Miami-Dade, 1746 Meridian Avenue, #33, Miami Beach, FL 33139.

Third: Said Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal Income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or (ii) by a corporation, contributions contributions which are deductable under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

The specific mission of the Corporation will be to outreach and provide training, information, scholarship, and performance to assist children and adults who are interested in the arts and/or are interested in personal adjustment through self-discovery.

Fourth: The period of duration of the Corporation shall be perpetual unless dissolved according to law. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; or the corresponding code of any future Internal Revenue Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the County in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine; which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Fifth: No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furthurance of the the purposes set forth in

Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this corporation participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.

Sixth: The initial Board of Directors shall consist of ten (10) persons. The number of Directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by an amendment to the Bylaws; however, there shall never be less than nine (9) Directors. All Directors shall be selected as provided for in the Bylaws. The Names and addresses of the persons who are members of the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation are as follows:
