## ARTICLES OF INCORPORTION OF LATINA AND LATINO CRITICAL LEGAL THEORY, INC

#### A FLORIDA NONPROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE 1.
Name

EFFECTIVE DATE
3-15-97

The name of the corporation is: LATINA AND LATINO CRITICAL LEGAL THEORY, INC.

#### ARTICLE 2. Principal Place of Business and Mailing Address.

The principal place of business is in the State of Florida. The address of the principle office and the mailing address of the Corporation is c/o Professor Elizabeth Iglesias, Center for Hispanic and Caribbean Legal Studies, University of Miami School of Law, 1311 Miller Drive, Suite 269, Coral Gables, Florida, 33146. The effective date of the Corporation is March 15, 1999. The duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

## ARTICLE 3. Purposes.

The purposes of the corporation are as follows:

#### 3.1 General Purposes.

- (a) To function as a not-for-profit corporation organized under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. It is not organized for the private gain of any person;
- (b) To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida upon nonprofit corporations;
- 3.2 Specific Purposes: The specific purposes of this corporation are to foster the development of Latina and Latino Critical Legal Theory [hereinafter referred to as "LatCrit theory"], to promote the dissemination of LatCrit scholarship, and to facilitate and enable the growth and further consolidation of the LatCrit movement as a network of legal and interdisciplinary scholars, public interest lawyers and non-governmental organizations committed to the values of anti-subordination and inter-group and intragroup justice, both domestically and internationally, by engaging in the following activities:

SOME TO PERSON

- (a) organizing conferences, workshops, symposia and other similar programs and events to promote substantive analysis and discussion of law, community and justice from a LatCrit perspective
- (b) fostering interdisciplinary and international participation and perspectives within all LatCrit sponsored programs
- (c) promoting original research, field work and data collection on matters deemed particularly relevant to the substantive development of LatCrit Theory.
- (d) publishing or otherwise promoting publication and dissemination of the findings, conclusions and results of the fieldwork and research projects conducted to advance the development of LatCrit Theory
- (e) conducting, collaborating and intervening in any appropriate law reform project or litigation of particular relevance to the stated purposes of LatCrit, Inc., except as prohibited by any applicable laws of the United States or of the State of Florida, or by any provision of the By-laws or Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation.

#### ARTICLE 4 Non-Profit Limitations

- 4.1 <u>Corporate Purposes:</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal and state income tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States International Revenue law.
- 4.2 <u>Exclusivity:</u> The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes.
- 4.3 No Private Inurement: The Corporation is not organized nor shall it operate for the primary purpose of generating pecuniary gain or profit. The Corporation shall not distribute any gains, profits or dividends to the Directors, Officers, or Members thereof, or to any individual, except as reasonable compensation for services actually performed in carrying on the Corporation's charitable and educational purposes. The property, assets, profits and net income of the Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes no part of which shall inure to the benefit of any individual.
- 4.4 <u>Lobbying and Political Campaigns</u>: No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of lobbying to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- 4.5 <u>Dissolution:</u> Upon winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the assets of the Corporation remaining after payment of all debts and liabilities shall be

distributed to an organization recognized as exempt under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to be used exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. If the Corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such a manner as may be directed by decree of the Circuit Court of the district in which the Corporation's principal office is located, upon petition thereof by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

4.6 Private Foundation Status: In the event that this Corporation shall become a "private foundation" within the meaning of section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code 1954, the Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to subject to tax under section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code; shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue code; shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code; and shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in section 4945 (d) of the Internal Revenue Code.

#### ARTICLE 5 Election of Directors and Qualification of Members

Directors shall be elected as provided in ¶3.2 of the bylaws. The qualification for members, if any, and the manner of their admission shall be regulated by the bylaws.

## ARTICLE 6 Initial Registered Agent and Office

The initial registered agent is Professor Elizabeth Iglesias and the initial registered office is c/o Professor Iglesias, Center for Hispanic and Caribbean Legal Studies, University of Miami School of Law, 1311 Miller Drive, Suite 269, Coral Gables, Florida, 33146.

## ARTICLE 7 Initial Board of Directors

The Initial Board of Directors shall have five (5) members whose names and addresses are:
