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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF CHRISTIAN POLICE ASSOCIATION OF PINELLAS COUNTY, INC.

THE UNDERSIGNED, as incorporator and on behalf of a not-for-profit, non-stock corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, as provided in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

Section 1.1. The name of the corporation is CHRISTIAN POLICE ASSOCIATION OF PINELLAS COUNTY, INC. (the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II DURATION

Section 2.1. The Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless dissolved pursuant to land

ARTICLE III NON-STOCK CORPORATION

Section 3.1. The Corporation shall be organized on a non-stock basis under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act.

ARTICLE IV PURPOSE

Section 4.1. This Corporation shall be a public charitable organization and shall exist and be operated for the sole purpose of raising, receiving and maintaining a fund or funds of property, both tangible and intangible, from broad solicitation of the public at large, and to distribute and administer such fund or funds, including any income or interest generated therefrom, either directly to individuals and families in need, or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto, as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. Such funds shall be allocated among various individuals, families and agencies in furtherance of youth crime prevention programs and in supporting and assisting the families of police officers killed or disabled in the line of duty, where such disbursements are intended primarily to benefit society in general, to advocate societal well-being and the well-being

of such affected individuals and families, and to ease financial burdens on various government and related agencies responsible for crime prevention programs and compensation/support for injured or deceased policemen and their families.

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ARTICLE V POWERS

Section 5.1. The Corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which a Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further accomplish, foster or attain any such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Corporation shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes and Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the regulations thereunder as the same now exist or as they may be hereinafter amended from time to time.

Section 5.2. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit or, or be distributable to, any Trustee or Officer of the Corporation or any other private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation affecting one or more of its purposes); and no Trustee or Officer of the Corporation, or any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

<u>Section 5.3</u>. To the extent the Corporation is or may become a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, the Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 5.4. To the extent the Corporation is or may become a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, the Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

<u>Section 5.5.</u> To the extent the Corporation is or may become a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, the Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

<u>Section 5.6</u>. To the extent the Corporation is or may become a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, the Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

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<u>Section 5.7</u>. To the extent the Corporation is or may become a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, the Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 5.8. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code and said Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

Section 5.9. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all the assets of the Corporation, exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation, exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes, as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction as provided by law, of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VI <u>MEMBERS</u>

<u>Section 6.1</u>. This Corporation shall have a membership consisting of the Board of Trustees of the Corporation serving from time to time.

ARTICLE VII TRUSTEES

<u>Section 7.1</u>. The affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of not less than three (3) Trustees (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), subject to the restriction that, except as specifically set forth to the contrary in the Bylaws, the exercise of any powers or actions of the Board shall require the approval thereof by a majority vote of the Board

present at a meeting at which a quorum of no less than two (2) Trustees is present. The number of Trustees may be increased from time to time in accord with the Bylaws. The affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees of record shall be necessary for all corporate action requiring a vote of the Board, including, but not limited to the following:

7.1.1. Approval of charitable gifts, transfers, distributions and grants by the Corporation to other entities.

7.1.2. Adoption of an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws.

7.1.3. Organization of a subsidiary or affiliate by the Corporation.

7.1.4. Approval of any merger, consolidation or sale or other transfer of all or a substantial part of the assets of the Corporation.

Section 7.2. The initial Board of Trustees shall be elected in accordance with the Bylaws.

Section 7.3. The term of office of an elected Trustee shall be one year.

ARTICLE VIII ADDRESS

Section 8.1. The street address of the principal office of this corporation in the State of Florida is 4631 86th Avenue North, Pinellas Park, FL 33782. The Board may, from time to time, move the principal office, in the manner provided by law in the State of Florida, to another place in this State.

ARTICLE IX REGISTERED AGENT AND REGISTERED OFFICE

Section 9.1. The registered agent and registered office of the Corporation shall be:

Section 10.1. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner and with the vote provided by law and the Bylaws.

ARTICLE XI BYLAWS

<u>Section 11.1</u>. The Board of Trustees of this Corporation shall adopt Bylaws for the government of this Corporation which shall be subordinate only to the Articles of Incorporation and the laws of the United States and the State of Florida. The Bylaws may be amended from time to time by the Board of Trustees.
