The undersigned, being a natural person of at least eighteen years of age and acting as the incorporator of the corporation hereby being formed under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of Florida, does hereby certify that:

FIRST: The name of the Corporation is: Name.

> John A. Strobis Charitable Foundation, Inc.

SECOND: General Purpose and Restrictions.

- The Corporation is a corporation described in Florida Statues Section 617.0301, in that it is not formed for pecuniary profit or financial gain, and no part of the assets, income or profit of the Corporation is distributable to, or inures to the benefit of its members, directors or officers or any private person except to the extent permissible under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.
- The Corporation shall be operated not for profit, but exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the Corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Internal Revenue code Section 501 © (3) or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.
- No part of the net earnings of this Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, director, officer or employee of the Corporation; no member, director, officer or employee of the Corporation shall receive or be lawfully entitled to receive any pecuniary benefit of any kind, except reasonable compensation for services in effecting one or more purposes of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of this Corporation shall consist in carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. This Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

<u>Purpose.</u> To solicit, collect and otherwise raise money for charitable, philanthropic, eleemosynary, and benevolent

purposes; to expend, contribute, disburse, and otherwise handle and dispose of the same for such purposes, either directly or by contributions to other agencies, organizations, or institutions organized for the same or similar purposes; to receive by gift, will or otherwise money or other property, and to distribute it as may be deemed best for the promotion of charity and philanthropy; and to do any and all other things necessary or proper in connection with or incidental to any of the foregoing.

FOURTH: Liquidation. In the event of liquidation, dissolution or winding up the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, no distribution of any of the property of assets of the Corporation shall be made to any member, director or officer or employee of the Corporation, but all of such property and assets shall be distributed to organizations exempt under Section 501 ° (3) of the Internal Revenue code and shall be applied to accomplish the charitable purposes for which this Corporation is organized, as the members of this Corporation, by majority vote, shall determine or as the by-laws of this Corporation shall direct.

FIFTH: Mandatory Distribution of Income. In any taxable year in which the Corporation is a private foundation as described in Section 509 (a) of the Internal Revenue Code, the Corporation shall distribute its income for said period at such time and manner as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; (b) of the Internal Revenue Code; (b) make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code; or make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.
