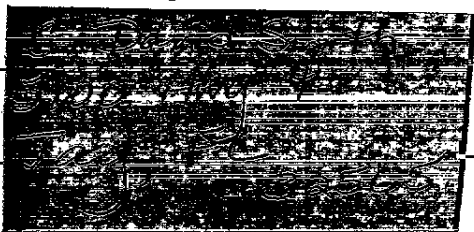

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
NORTHWEST FLORIDA INSULATION & SHELVING, INC.

The undersigned acting as incorporator of the corporation adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is Northwest Florida Insulation & Shelving, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The period of duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- (a) To engage in the insulation of commercial and residential construction both new and existing, and to conduct any and every kind of business in the insulation and shelving and home improvement industry, or any such other services deemed appropriate by management, in the field of providing insulation or any field relating thereto or any such other field as deemed necessary by management.
- (b) To do all and everything necessary, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, the attainment of any of the objects, or the exercise of any of the powers herein set forth either alone or in conjunction with other corporations, firms, or individuals, and either as principals or agents, and to do every other act or acts, thing or things, incidental or pertinent to or growing out of or connected with the above mentioned objects, purposes, or powers.
- (c) To conduct and carry on its business or any branch thereof in any state or territory of the United States or in any foreign country in conformity with the laws of such state, territory, or foreign country a business office, medical clinic, or other facility.
- (d) The corporation hereby formed shall have power to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire by bequest, devise, gift, or other means, and to hold, own, manage, or develop, and to mortgage, hypothecate, deed in trust, sell, convey, exchange, option, subdivide, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description and any

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estate or interest therein, as may be necessary or convenient for the proper conduct of the affairs of the corporation, without limitation as to amount or value, in any of the states, districts, or territories of the United States, and in any and all foreign countries, subject to the laws of any such states, districts, territories, or countries

- (e) To erect, construct, maintain, improve, rebuild, enlarge, alter, manage and control, directly or through ownership of stock in any corporation any and all kinds of buildings, houses, stores, offices, shops, warehouses, factories, mills, machinery, and plants, and any and all other structures and erections that may at any time be necessary, useful or advantageous for the purposes of the corporation.
- (f) To apply for, purchase, or by other means acquire, hold, sell, assign, lease, or otherwise dispose of, and protect, prolong, and renew, whether in the United States or elsewhere, any patents, patent rights, inventions, processes, licenses, protections, concessions, trademarks, and trade names that may appear likely to be advantageous or useful to the corporation, and to use and turn to account and to manufacture under or grant licenses or privileges in respect of the same, and to expend money in experimenting on and testing and improving or seeking to improve any patents, inventions, or rights that the corporation may acquire or propose to acquire.
- (g) To acquire all or any part of the good will, rights, franchises, property, and business or any person, firm, association, or corporation, engaged in any business similar to the business of this corporation, and to pay for it in cash or in stock or obligations of the corporation or otherwise, and to hold, utilize, enjoy, and in any manner dispose of the whole or any part of the rights and properties so acquired, and to assume in connection therewith any liabilities of any such person, firm, association, or corporation, and to conduct in a lawful manner the whole or any part of the business thus acquired.
- (h) To enter into and perform all manner and kinds of contracts, agreements, and obligations for any lawful purpose by or with any person, firm association, corporation, or governmental division or subdivision.
- (i) To hire and employ agents, servants, and employees; to enter into agreements of employment and collective bargaining agreements; and to act as agent, contractor, trustee, factor, or otherwise, either alone or in company with others.
- (j) To promote and assist, financially or otherwise,

corporations, firms, syndicates, associations, individuals, and others and to give any guaranty in connection therewith or otherwise for the payment of money or for the performance of any other undertaking or obligation.

- (k) From time to time to apply for, purchase, or acquire by assignment, transfer, or otherwise, and to exercise, carry out, and enjoy and license, power, authority, franchise, concession, right, or privilege that any government or authority, Federal, State, or local or any corporation or other legal entity may be empowered to enact, make, or grant, and to pay for, aid in, and contribute toward carrying it into effect and to appropriate any of the company's stock, bonds, and assets to defray the necessary cost, charges, and expenses thereto
- (l) To enter into partnership agreements and joint ventures with any person, firm, association, or corporation engaged in carrying on any business in which the corporation is authorized to engage, or in connection with carrying out all or any of the purposes of this corporation.
- (m) To act as financial, commercial, or general agent or representative of any corporation, association, firm, syndicate, or individual, and as such to develop, improve, and extend the property, trade, and business interests thereof, and to aid any lawful enterprise in connection therewith.
- (n) To indorse or guarantee the payment of principal of, or interest on, bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness or obligations, and to guarantee the performance of any other contracts or other undertakings in which the corporation may otherwise be or become interested, or any corporation, association, partnership, firm, trustee, syndicate, individual, or governmental division or subdivision, domestic or foreign, insofar as may be permitted by law.
- (o) To borrow money, and to draw, make, accept, indorse, issue, sell or otherwise deal lawfully in promissory notes, bills of exchange, bonds, debentures, or any other negotiable or transferable obligations or instruments from time to time for any purposes of, or concerning the business of, the corporation.
- (p) To secure the payment of corporate indebtedness by executing mortgages, deeds in trust, pledges, or similar instruments with respect to all or any part of the property of the corporation, whether new owned or to be acquired in the future.
- (q) To establish and maintain a fund to provide pensions for the benefit of employees and their dependents, and to establish and contribute to group life and health insurance

plans for the benefit of employees and their dependents.

ARTICLE IV

The location of the principal office of the corporation in the State of Florida shall be 4020 Charles Circle Pace, Florida 32571.

ARTICLE V

The total number of shares of stock, which the corporation shall have authority to issue, shall be 5,000 shares of common stock of the par value of \$1.00 per share.
