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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

OSCEOLA AGRICULTURAL SERVICES, INC.

JALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Florida Corporation Act, hereby adopt the following ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is OSCEOLA AGRICULTURAL SERVICES, The principal office and mailing address of the corporation is 1123 Vermont Ave., St. Cloud, Florida 34769.

ARTICLE II

The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual. The date of the commencement of corporate existence shall be the date the ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION are filed with the Secretary of State.

ARTICLE III

The general purposes for which the corporation is organized

- To engage in the business of the purchase, sale, barter, and exchange of hay, and other grasses, and all other similar agricultural products and commodities, and to engage in the business of growing and producing hay, grasses, and all other related agricultural products.
- To engage in the business of buying, selling, dealing in, operating, and otherwise employing machinery, equipment, and tools for cutting, gathering, baling, and drying all types and kinds of hay and agricultural grasses, and to engage in the business of storing, transporting, marketing, distributing, and otherwise dealing in such commodities and products.
- To transact any other trade or business which can, in the opinion of the management of the corporation, be advantageously carried on in connection with or auxiliary to the general purposes of the corporation, and to engage in any activity or business permitted under the laws of the United States and of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE IV

The maximum number of shares of stock that this corporation is authorized to issue and have outstanding at any one time is one hundred (100) shares of common stock having a par value of ONE (\$1.00) DOLLAR per share. The stock shall be issued and redeemed as follows:

- There shall be one class of common stock; there shall be no preferred stock, and the stock shall not be issued as a special class in series. The shareholders shall not have any pre-emptive rights.
- 2. The consideration to be paid for each share shall be fixed by the Board of Directors and any and all shares so issued, the full consideration for which has been paid or delivered, shall be deemed fully paid stock, and not liable to any further call or assessment thereon, and the holders of such shares shall not be liable for any further payments thereon.
- 3. The capital stock may be paid for in property, labor, or services at a just valuation to be fixed by the incorporator, or by the director or directors.
- 4. The stock shall be issued from time to time as may be determined by the Board of Directors.
- 5. Upon dissolution or liquidation of the corporation, the holders of the stock shall be entitled to distribution as holdings may appear upon the stock record of the corporation.

ARTICLE V

The presence, at any stockholders meeting, in person or by proxy, of persons entitled to vote a simple majority of the shares of the corporation then issued and outstanding shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of a simple majority of the outstanding shares of the corporation shall be the act of the stockholders.

<u>ARTICLE VI</u>

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These ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION may be amended in the manner provided by law. The amendment shall be approved by the Board of Directors, proposed by them to the stockholders and approved at a stockholders meeting by a simple majority of the stock entitled to vote, unless all of the directors and all of the stockholders sign a written document stating their intention that a certain amendment of these ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION be made.

ARTICLE VII

The initial street address of the registered office of the corporation in the State of Florida is 1123 Vermont Ave., St. Cloud, Florida 34769. The name of the initial registered agent at that address is CASEY ROBINSON.

ARTICLE VIII

The initial directors of this corporation are JOHN P. WETZEL, JR., whose address is 5308 E. Irlo Bronson Memorial Highway, St.

Cloud, Florida 34771, CASEY ROBINSON, whose address is 1123 Vermont Ave., St. Cloud, Florida 34769, and MATTHEW K. WETZEL, 1355 Emerald Drive, Kissimmee, Florida 34744. At the first annual meeting of the shareholders, and at each annual meeting thereafter, the shareholders shall elect a director or directors, to hold office until the next succeeding annual meeting of shareholders. There shall never be less than one director.


