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## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

Deborah G. Freeman, P.A.



The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation") under the Florida Business Corporation Act, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

Article I: The name of the corporation shall be Deborah G. Freeman, P.A.

Article II: The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be 286 Palm Avenue, Miami Beach, Florida 33139.

Article III: The number of shares of stock that the corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any one time is one thousand (1,000), all of which are of a par value of one dollar each and classified as Common shares.

Article VI: Shareholders shall be entitled as a matter of right to a preemptive right, for a period of thirty days, to subscribe for, purchase or receive any shares of the corporation which it may issue or sell, whether out of the number of shares authorized by these Articles of Incorporation or by amendment thereof, or out of the shares of the corporation acquired by it after the issuance thereof, any shareholder shall be entitled as a matter of right to purchase or subscribe for or receive any bonds, debentures, or other obligations which the corporation may issue or sell that shall be convertible into or exchangeable for shares, or to which shall be attached or shall appertain to any warrant or warrants or other instrument or instruments that shall confer upon the holder or owner of such obligation the right to subscribe for or purchase from the corporation any shares of any class or classes; and after the expiration of said thirty

days, any and all of such shares, rights, bonds, debentures or other obligations which the corporation may have issued, reissued, transferred, or granted by the Board of Directors, as the case may be, to such persons, firms, corporations, and associations, and for such lawful consideration, and on such terms, as the Board of Directors in its discretion may determine.

Article VII: The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized, including the authority of the corporation to transact any lawful business for which corporations may be organized under the provisions of the Florida Statutes, are as follows:

To transact a general real estate and brokerage business, including the renting and managing of estates; to act as broker, or attorney in fact for any person or corporation in buying, selling, and dealing in real estate and real property, and any interest and estates therein; on commission; to make or obtain loans upon such property, and to supervise, manage, and protect such property and all loans, interest in, and claims affecting the same.

Article VIII: The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.

Article IX: The corporation shall, to the fullest extent legally permissible under the provisions of the Florida Business Corporation Act, as the same may be amended and supplemented, shall indemnify and hold harmless any and all persons whom it shall have power to indemnify under said provisions from and against any and all liabilities (including expenses) imposed upon or reasonably incurred by him in connection with any action, suit or other proceeding in which he may be involved or with which he may be threatened, or other matters referred to in or covered by said provisions both as to action in his official capacity and as to action in any other capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director or officer of the corporation. Such indemnification provided shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those indemnified may be entitled under any Bylaw, Agreement or Resolution adopted by the shareholders entitled to vote thereon after notice.
