Dear Department of State,

I am writing this letter to address a serious situation on the behalf of my corporation. I have recently discovered a situation that is beyond my control. I have no recourse other than to "attempt with full honesty and earnest effort to correct the situation". I am asking for an abatement of traditional penalties and interest in this extreme case. I have been incorporated since 7/12/2000 and have to the best of my ability complied with the Florida and Federal filing requirements. I have successfully filed payroll tax reports, corporate tax returns since the inception of my business. I have without fail tried to my best ability to comply with all rules and regulations.

The purpose of this letter to explain this unfortunate situation and plead for some sort of understanding and fairness. Here we go:

In 2001, I re-located my business to a new location. I properly filed change of address forms and filed a forwarding address request. However, I did have some problems with my mail route. I also had issues with my former landlord in regards to forwarding some of my mail. I tried to the best of my ability to resolve these issues. However, there were some problems accounting for all of my mail. In the move, I made sure to address all filing requirements which I received mail correspondence for. For the record, I did properly and timely file my quarterly Florida Unemployment Tax reports. I did attempt to comply with all filing requirements.

It came to my attention on 2/1/2005 when I went to renew some of my business contracts with a vendor. The vendor made me aware of that my corporation had been "ADMIN DISSOLUTION FOR ANNUAL REPORT". As soon as I realized this, I researched the issue. I researched my account history on the website after speaking with someone at the Division of Corporations. I soon discovered that the mailing address of record on the website was my old address. So, the annual corporate report must have been mailed to that address and NEVER forwarded to my new address. I am writing to ask for some understanding on this issue given my filing history, earnest attempt to correct the situation and honesty. I am writing to request a fair resolution to this error. I would have filed these forms if I would have received them in the mail properly. I understand the filing requirements now and promise to comply with them in the future.

I am sending in the Reinstatement Application along with a check for Annual renewal fees for 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005. I am a small business owner who has made a mistake via the mail system. Please accept these payments and re-instatement my corporation. This situation has caused
