ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

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LIFE STAGES FINANCIALS, INC.

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The undersigned subscribers to these Articles of SECRETARY OF STATE
Incorporation, each a natural person competent to contract, TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA
hereby associate themselves together to form a corporation
under these laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I-NAME

The name of this corporation is:

LIFE STAGES FINANCIALS, INC.

ARTICLE II - PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal place of business and mailing address of this
corporation shall be:

13831 S.W. 59TH STREET, SUITE 207
MIAMI, FLORIDA 33183

ARTICLE III-NATURE OF BUSINESS

The general nature of business to be transacted by this
corporation shall be to manufacture, purchase, or otherwise
acquire and to own, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, transfer,
or otherwise dispose of, and to export, invest in, trade in,
deal in and with goods, wares, merchandise, real and personal
property, and services, of every class, kind, and
descriptions; except that it is not to conduct banking, safe
deposit, trust, insurance, surety, express, railroad, canal,
telegraph, telephone or cemetery company, a building and

loan association, mutual fire insurance association, fraternal benefit society, cooperative association, state fair or exposition. The corporation may carry on any lawful business necessary or incidental to the attainment of the objectives of the corporation.

ARTICLE IV - POWERS

The powers herein granted to the corporation shall not be construed as any limitation upon the powers of the corporation but shall be in addition to the powers conferred by law. The corporation shall have the power to do the following:

1. To invest its funds in real estate, mortgages, stock, bonds or any other type of investment and to own or lease real or personal property necessary for or incidental to the rendering of professional services;

2. To sue and to be sued and appear and defend all acts and proceedings in its corporate name to the same extent as a natural person;

3. To adopt and use a common corporate seal and alter the same;

4. To appoint such officers, agents and employees as its affairs shall require and allow them suitable compensation;

5. To make and enter into all contracts necessary and proper for the conduct of its business;

6. To purchase the corporate assets of any other corporation;

7. To take, hold, sell and convey such property as may be necessary in order to obtain or secure payment of any indebtedness or liability to it;

8. To guarantee, endorse, purchase, hold, sell, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of the shares of the capital stock or any bonds or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation of this State or any other State or Government; while owner of such stock to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote such stock;

9. To purchase, hold, sell, and transfer shares of its own capital stock or any of its own capital stock, but it cannot purchase any of its own capital stock except from the surplus of its assets over its liabilities, including capital. Shares of its own capital stock owned by the corporation shall not be voted directly or indirectly or counted as outstanding stock for the purpose of any stockholders' quorum or vote;

10. To contract debts and borrow money at such rate of interest not to exceed the lawful interest rate and upon such terms as it or its Board of Directors may deem necessary or expedient and shall authorize or agree upon. Issue and sell or pledge bonds, debentures, notes and other evidence of indebtedness whether secured or unsecured, and execute mortgages or other instruments or encumbrances upon its

property or credit to secure the payment of money borrowed or owing by it, as occasion may require and the Board of Directors deem expedient. To transfer corporate property of every kind and nature belonging to the corporation, as security for the payment of any bonds, notes, debts, or other evidence of indebtedness of the corporation.

ARTICLE V - CAPITAL STOCK

The maximum number of shares of stock which this corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any time shall be ONE HUNDRED SHARES (100) of common stock having a par value of \$ 1.00 each share.

The capital stock may be paid for in property, labor or services, at a just valuation to be fixed by the incorporators, or by the Directors at a meeting called for such purpose, or at the organizational meeting.

Property, labor or services may also be purchased or paid for with the capital stock at a just valuation of said property, labor or services, to be fixed by the Directors of the company.

Stock in other corporations or going businesses may be purchased by the corporation in return for the issuance of its capital stock and said purchase shall be on such basis and for such consideration and the issuance of so much of the capital stock as the Directors of the company may decide.

ARTICLE VI - INITIAL CAPITAL

The amount of capital with which this corporation may begin business shall not be less than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$ 100.00).

ARTICLE VII - TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE VIII - DIRECTORS

This Corporation shall have (1) Director initially. The number of Directors may be increased from time to time, pursuant to the by-laws adopted by stockholders, but shall never be less than one.

ARTICLE IX - INITIAL DIRECTORS



all other rights to which that person may be entitled.


