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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

APPLIED PHOTOGRAPHIC CONCEPTS, INC.

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation for profit under the laws of the State of the Profit and the state of t Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

### ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation is Applied Photographic Concepts, Inc.

#### PRINCIPAL OFFICE OR MAILING ADDRESS ARTICLE II:

The principal office of the corporation will be at a location to be determined within Duval County, Florida. The mailing address of the corporation is 14103 Colonial Grand Boulevard, Apt. 1716, Orlando, Florida 32837.

### ARTICLE III: CAPITAL STOCK

- Authorized Shares. The total number of shares that may be issued by the corporation is 100,000, all of which shall be of the same class, shall be of the par value of \$.10 per share, and shall be designated common stock.
- Capital Stock. The capital of the corporation shall be at least equal to the sum of the aggregate par value of all issued shares having par value, plus such amounts as, from time to time, by resolution of the Board of Directors, may be transferred thereto.
- Corporation Liquidation and Dissolution. In the event of voluntary or involuntary liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the corporation, the holders of record of the common stock shall be entitled to receive distribution, ratably, of the remaining assets of the corporation.
- Voting. Each share of common stock shall have equal and full voting powers (d) and rights, and the holders of record thereof shall be entitled to one vote for each share so held. At all meetings of shareholders a majority in number of shares entitled to vote at such meetings, present either in person or represented by proxy, shall constitute a quorum.
  - Preemptive Rights. Shareholders shall have no preemptive rights. (e)
  - Cumulative Voting. Cumulative voting shall not be permitted. (f)
- Restrictions on Transfer of Stock. The shareholders may, by bylaw provision or by shareholders' agreement recorded in the minute book, impose such restrictions on the sale, transfer, or encumbrance of the stock of this corporation as they may see fit.

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## ARTICLE IV: INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of this corporation is 14103 Colonial Grand Boulevard, Apt. 1716, Orlando, Florida 32837, and the name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Anthony Burkardt.

ARTICLE VI: DIRECTORS

- (a) <u>Number</u>. The corporation shall have one director initially. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by bylaws adopted by unanimous vote of the shareholders.
- (b) <u>Initial Board of Directors</u>. The name and address of the director until the first annual meeting of the shareholders are as follows:

- (c) <u>Compensation</u>. The Board of Directors is hereby specifically authorized to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as directors, and to fix the basis and conditions upon which such compensation shall be paid. Any director of the corporation may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation therefore in any form.
- (d) <u>Indemnification</u>. The Board of Directors is hereby specifically authorized to make provision for indemnification of directors, officers, employees and agents to the full extent permitted by law.

#### ARTICLE VII: BYLAWS

The initial Bylaws of this corporation shall be adopted by the directors. Bylaws shall be adopted, altered, amended or repealed from time to time by either the shareholders or the Board of Directors, but the Board of Directors shall not alter, amend or repeal any bylaw adopted by the shareholders if the shareholders specifically provide that such bylaw is not subject to amendment or repeal by the directors.
