ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF PAIN INSTITUTE OF FLORIDA, P.A.

The undersigned incorporator, a natural person competent to contract and a

Doctor of Osteopathy duly licensed to render services as such under the laws of the State of

Florida, hereby forms a corporation for profit under the Professional Service Corporation Act

and other laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I - NAME AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE OF CORPORATION

The name of this corporation will be **Pain Institute of Florida**, **P.A.**. The principal office and mailing address for the corporation will be 1435 Division Avenue, Ocoee, Florida 34761.

ARTICLE II - GENERAL NATURE OF BUSINESS

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation will be:

- A. To engage in every phase and aspect of the business of rendering the same professional services to the public that a Doctor of Osteopathy or Doctor of Medicine duly licensed under the laws of the State of Florida is authorized to render, but such professional services will be rendered only through officers, employees and agents of the corporation who are duly licensed under the laws of the State of Florida to practice medicine therein.
- B. To invest the funds of the corporation in real estate, mortgages, stocks, bonds or any other type of investment, and to own real and personal property necessary for the rendering of such professional services.
- C. To do anything necessary and proper for the accomplishment or furtherance of any of the purposes or objectives of the corporation enumerated in these Articles of

Incorporation or any amendment thereto, and to do any act necessary or incidental to the protection and benefit of the corporation; and in general, either alone or in association with other corporations, firms or individuals, to carry on any lawful pursuit necessary or incidental to the accomplishment or furtherance of such purposes or objectives of the corporation.

D. It is intended that this corporation may conduct and transact any business lawfully authorized and not prohibited by Chapter 607 and Chapter 621, Florida Statutes, as the same may be from time to time amended.
