WE, the undersigned, do hereby associate ourselves together and subscribe these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, Chapter 607 and subject to the following provisions:

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the Corporation shall be:

HOWLERS, INC.

ARTICLE TWO

This corporation shall have perpetual existence and may engage in any activity or business permitted under the laws of the United States and of the State of Florida.

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this Corporation shall be:

A) To engage in the business of domestic and international distribution and consultation in matters of distribution of products of all nature and kind, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of Florida upon corporations formed under its laws, and to do any or all things hereinabove set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do.

ARTICLE THREE

The maximum number of shares of stock which the Corporation shall have outstanding at any time shall be One Hundred (100) shares, common stock, One (\$1.00) Dollar par value.
