Under the provisions of F.S. 607.1006, this corporation adopts the following articles of amendment to its articles of incorporation:

FIRST:

Article 1, Name

The name of the corporation is changed, and shall be **ACORN TRADING GROUP, INCORPORATED.**


SECOND:

Article 3, Shares

The corporation may issue 5,000 shares. Shares shall be uncertificated, unless the board of directors determines that a business purpose would be served, and may direct the issuance of shares. The Secretary of the Corporation shall record all share transactions. No shareholder may be acknowledged or recognized for any reason unless and until their stock ownership is recorded on the corporate records. Shares are no par. The President of the Corporation shall perform the duties and functions of the Secretary unless, and until, a Secretary is elected.
