ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF PAIGE KREEGEL, M.D., P.A.

The undersigned incorporator hereby forms a professional corporation in accordance with the Florida Professional Service Corporation Act, Fla. Stat. Chap. 621, adopts the following articles of incorporation for the corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The corporations name is PAIGE KREEGEL, M.D., P.A.

ARTICLE II - PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT

The address of the corporation's principal office is 201 W. Marion Avenue, Suite 207, City of Punta Gorda, County of Charlotte, State of Florida 33950. The name of the initial registered agent of the corporation, located at that office, is James W. Kaywell.

ARTICLE III - DURATION

The period of the corporation's duration shall be perpetual, or until dissolved on a vote of the shareholders as provided in these articles.

ARTICLE IV - PURPOSE

This corporation is organized for the following purposes:

a. To engage in the practice of medicine as a professional corporation and to operate a medical clinic for the purposes of providing medical care and treatment.

b. To associate or otherwise contract with other physicians, professional service corporations, hospitals, health care providers, health maintenance organizations, independent physician associations, physician provider organizations and other entities, associations or mediums necessary or helpful for the provision of health care services to patients.

c. To promote medical, surgical, and scientific research and knowledge; to furnish related laboratory and clinical services; and to own real and personal property, enter into contracts, and engage in any lawful business necessary for the rendering of the professional medical services.

d. To do everything necessary, proper, or convenient to accomplish any of the purposes set forth in these articles, and to do every other act incidental to the corporate purposes which is not forbidden by Florida laws or by the provisions of these articles of incorporation.

The purposes of this corporation shall be carried out only through officers, employees, and agents, each of whom is licensed or otherwise legally qualified to render professional medical services in the State of Florida.

#### ARTICLE V - CAPITAL STOCK

The total number of shares of stock which the corporation shall be authorized to issue or have outstanding at any one time is Ten Thousand Shares (10,000) shares. These shares shall be of a single class of common stock, and shall have a value of \$ .10 per share.

#### ARTICLE VI - CAPITALIZATION

The amount of capital with which the corporation will begin to practice the profession of medicine is not less than \$100.00.

#### ARTICLE VII - CORPORATE POWERS

The corporation shall have all the rights and powers now or subsequently conferred on professional corporations by the laws of the State of Florida, including, but not limited to those specified in the Florida Business Corporation Act, Fla. Stat. Chap. 607, and the Florida Professional Service Corporation Act, Fla. Stat. Chap. 621, as the same may be amended from time to time, including the following powers:

(1) To sue and be sued, complain, and defend in its corporate name;

(2) To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at will and to use it or a facsimile of it, by impressing or affixing it or in any other manner reproducing it;

(3) To purchase, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use, and otherwise deal with real or personal property or any legal or equitable interest in property wherever located;

(4) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property;

(5) To lend money to, and use its credit to assist, its officers and employees in accordance with Fla. Stat. s. 607.0833;

(6) To purchase, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire; own, hold, vote, use, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose

of; and deal in and with shares or other interests in, or obligations of, any other entity;

(7) To make contracts and guarantees, incur liabilities, borrow money, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations (which may be convertible into or include the option to purchase other securities of the corporation), and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of any of its property, franchises, and income and make contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of a corporation the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by the contracting corporation; a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, a majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting corporation; or a corporation the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, the majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting corporation, which contracts of guaranty and suretyship shall be deemed to be necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation, and make other contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation;

(8) To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and receive and hold real and personal property as security for repayment;

(9) To conduct its business, locate offices, and exercise the powers granted by this act within or without this state;

(10) To elect directors and appoint officers, employees, and agents of the corporation and define their duties, fix their compensation, and lend them money and credit;

(11) To make and amend bylaws, not inconsistent with its articles of incorporation or with the laws of this state, for managing the business and regulating the affairs of the corporation;

(12) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes;

(13) To transact any lawful business that will aid governmental policy;

(14) To make payments or donations or do any other act not inconsistent with law that furthers the business and affairs of the corporation;

(15) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, pension trusts, profit-sharing plans, share bonus plans, share option plans, and

benefit or incentive plans for any or all of its current or former directors, officers, employees, and agents and for any or all of the current or former directors, officers, employees, and agents of its subsidiaries;

(16) To provide insurance for its benefit on the life of any of its directors, officers, or employees, or on the life of any shareholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by the shareholder or by the spouse or children of the shareholder; and

(17) To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other entity.

#### ARTICLE VIII - INCORPORATORS

The name and street address of each person signing these articles of incorporation as an incorporator is:

ARTICLE IX - DIRECTORS

The corporation is to be managed by a board of directors. The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors is one (1), and the name and address of the initial director is:

The initial director shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified as provided in the bylaws. Then the term of office of each director shall be an annual term and until the election and qualification of a successor. The number of directors set forth in these articles of incorporation and constituting the initial board of directors shall be the authorized number of directors until that number is changed by a bylaw duly adopted by the shareholders.

#### ARTICLE X - BYLAWS

The initial director shall submit the proposed bylaws to the shareholders at a meeting to be held for that purpose not more than thirty (30) days following the issuance of the Certificate of

Incorporation. Following the adoption of bylaws by affirmative vote of the shareholders, the internal affairs of the corporation are to be regulated and managed in accordance with the bylaws.

#### ARTICLE XI - DISSOLUTION

The corporation may be dissolved at any time (1) by unanimous written consent of the shareholders; or (2) on the affirmative vote of the holders of at least two-thirds of the outstanding shares of the corporation entitled to vote. On dissolution, the corporate property and assets shall, after payment of all debts of the corporation, be distributed to the shareholders pro rata, each shareholder to participate in the distribution in direct proportion to the number of shares held by the shareholder.

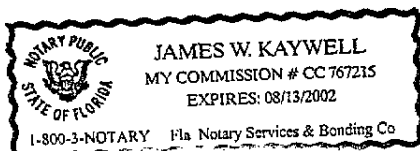




