ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FIRST COAST CARPET & BULDING MAINTENANCE, INC.

We, the undersigned, all being sui juris, do hereby agree for ourselves, under the laws of the State of Florida, Florida Statute 607 et seq. and the provisions therein providing for the formation, rights, liabilities, privileges, benefits, and obligations conferred and imposed by said laws on the corporations for profit, do hereby subscribe to and adopt the Articles set forth herein.

ARTICLE ONE: Name

The name of this Corporation shall be First Coast Carpet & Building Maintenance, Inc.

ARTICLE TWO: Duration

First Coast Carpet & Building Maintenance, Inc. shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE THREE: Purpose

The general and specific purposes for which is organized are to:
