ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

UPTOWN SALON II, INC.

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The undersigned subscriber to these Articles of Incorporation, a natural person competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the Laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE ONE: NAME

The name of this corporation is UPTOWN SALON II, INC.

ARTICLE TWO: NATURE OF BUSINESS

This corporation is being formed for the purpose of providing all salon services and related supplies and products; and further to exercise all those powers granted by Law, including but not limited to the following:
