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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

A THOUSAND SMILES, INC.



The undersigned incorporator of this corporation under the "Florida Business Corporation Act," as amended, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I Name of Corporation

The name of this Corporation is

A THOUSAND SMILES, INC.

ARTICLE II General Purpose

This corporation is organized for the purpose of operating a holding company and for transacting any and all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the "Florida Business Corporation Act."

ARTICLE III General Powers and Duration

This corporation shall have perpetual duration and has the same powers as an individual to do all things necessary or convenient to carry out its business and affairs, including without limitation power:

- 1. To sue and be sued, complain, and defend in its corporate name;
- To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at will and to use it for a facsimile of it, by impressing or affixing it or in any other manner reproducing it;

 To purchase, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use, and otherwise deal with real or personal property or any legal or equitable interest in property wherever located;

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- To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property;
- To lend money to, and to use its credit to assist, its officers and employees in accordance with F.S. Section 607.0833;
- 6. To purchase, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of; and deal in and with shares or other interest in, or obligations of, any other entity;
- 7. To make contracts and guarantees, incur liabilities, borrow money, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations (which may be convertible into or include option to purchase other securities of the corporation), and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of any of its property, franchises, and income and make contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of a corporation the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, the majority of the outstanding stock of the guaranty and suretyship shall be deemed to be necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation, and make other contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting corporation;

- To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds and receive and hold real and personal property as security for repayment;
- To conduct its business, locate offices, and exercise the powers granted by the "Florida Business Corporation Act" within or without this State;
- 10. To elect directors and appoint officers, employees, and agents of the corporation and define their duties, fix their compensation, and lend them money and credit;
- 11. To make and amend bylaws, not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation or with the laws of this State, for managing the business and regulating the affairs of the corporation;
- 12. To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes;
- 13. To transact any lawful business that will aid governmental policy;
- 14. To make payments or donations or do any other act both inconsistent with law that furthers the business and affairs of the corporation;
- 15. To pay pensions and establish plans, pension trust, profit sharing plans and benefits or incentive plans for any or all of its current or former directors, officers, employees, and agents and for any or all of its subsidiaries.
- 16. To provide insurance for its benefit on the life or any of its directors, officers, or employees, or on the life of any shareholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by the shareholder or by the spouse or children of the shareholder; and

17. To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other entity.

ARTICLE IV Capital Stock

The maximum number of shares of stock that this corporation is authorized to have outstanding by any one time is 1,000 shares of common stock having a par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) per share.

ARTICLE V Directors

The business of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors. There shall be three (3) directors initially. The number of directors may be increased, and after such increase, decreased from time to time by Bylaws adopted by the shareholders. In no event shall the number of directors be less that one (3).
