The undersigned subscriber, who is duly licensed to practice law in the State of Florida, for the purpose of forming a professional corporation under the laws of the State of Florida hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

**ARTICLE I
Name**

The name of this corporation is Altier & Robertson, P.A.

**ARTICLE II
Date of Subscription**

The date when corporate existence shall commence shall be the date of adoption of these articles, and the corporation shall have perpetual existence thereafter.

**ARTICLE III
Nature of Business**

The corporation is organized to practice the profession of law and its purposes in furtherance of the practice of law profession are as follows:

(a) To engage in every phase and aspect of the business of rendering the same professional services to the public that a lawyer licensed under the laws of the State of Florida, is allowed to render, but such professional services shall be rendered only through individuals authorized by the laws of the State of Florida to render such professional services as individuals.

- (e) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, state a security interest in, lease, exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.
- (f) To lend money to and use its credit to assist its officers. and employees to the full extent permitted by law.
- (g) To purchase, take, receive subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell. mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other municipality or any instrumentality thereof
- (h) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises, and income.

(i) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.

(j) To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this act within or without this state.

(k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation and define their duties and fix their compensation,
