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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SMILEY 451, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation for profit under the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

Article I - Name

The name of the corporation (the "Corporation") is:

SMILEY 451, INC.

Article II - Effective Date

The effective date of these Articles of Incorporation is the date these articles are filed with the Florida Secretary of State.

Article III - Term

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless dissolved pursuant to law.

Article IV - Purpose

The general nature of the services to be rendered by the Corporation shall be all business allowed by law for profit corporations.

Article V - Capital Stock

The maximum number of shares of stock which the Corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any one time is 1,000 shares of common stock, par value \$1.00 per share.

Article VI - Address

Article X - Other Provisions

1. The shareholders may, pursuant to the Bylaws or by shareholders' agreement, record in the

- minute book and impose such restrictions on the sale, transfer or encumbrances of the stock of the Corporation as they deem fit.
- 2. The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall adopt Bylaws for the government of the Corporation which shall be subordinate only to the Certificate of Incorporation and the laws of the Untied States and the State of Florida. The Bylaws may be amended from time to time by either the shareholders or the Board of Directors, but the Board of Directors may not alter or amend any Bylaws adopted by the shareholders.

- 4. If the Bylaws so provide, any action of the shareholders or Board of Directors which is required or permitted to be taken at a meeting may be taken without a meeting, in the manner provided in the Bylaws, to the extent now or hereafter to be permitted under the statutes and the laws of the State of Florida.
- 5. If the Bylaws so provide, any shareholder of the Corporation, to the extent now or hereafter permitted pursuant to the Bylaws of the Corporation and the statutes and laws of the State of Florida, may enter into any written agreement relating to any phase of the affairs of the Corporation. No such agreement shall impose Directors' or officers' liabilities upon the shareholders who are parties thereto except to the extent required by the statutes and laws of the State of Florida.
- 6. The Board of Directors of the Corporation is authorized to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as Directors and to fix the basis and conditions upon which such compensation shall be paid. Any Director of the Corporation may also serve the Corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation therefor in any form.
- 7. The Corporation shall indemnify any Director, officer, employee or agent or former Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, or any person who may have served at the Corporation's request as a Director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, limited liability company or other enterprise in which the Corporation owns shares of capital stock or other interests, or of which the Corporation is a creditor, against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by him or her in connection with the defense of any action, suit or proceeding in which he or she is made a party by reason of being or having been such Director, officer, employee or agent, except in relation to matters as to which he or she shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of duty. The extent, amount and eligibility for the indemnification shall be made by the Board of Directors. Determination will be made by a majority of a committee composed of the Directors not involved in the matter of controversy

(when the Corporation has more than one Director and whether or not a quorum; when the Corporation has one Director, that Director alone may find for indemnification). The Corporation may also reimburse any Director, officer, employee or agent the reasonable costs of settlement of any such action, suit or proceeding, if it shall be found by a majority of a committee composed of the Directors not involved in the matter of controversy (when the Corporation has more than one Director and whether or not a quorum; when the Corporation has one Director, that Director alone may find for reimbursement) that it was in the interests of the Corporation that such settlement be made and that such Director, officer, employee or agent was not guilty of negligence or misconduct. Such indemnification and reimbursement shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such Director, officer, employee or agent may be entitled under any Bylaw, agreement, vote of shareholders or otherwise.

Article XI - Preemptive Rights

Each shareholder of the Corporation shall be entitled to full preemptive rights to acquire his or her proportional part of any unissued or treasury shares of the Corporation, or securities of the Corporation convertible into, or carrying the right to subscribe to or acquire such shares, which may be issued at any time by the Corporation.

Article XII - Registered Office

The Registered Agent and Registered Office of the Corporation shall be 2748 Oak Tree Lane Oakland Park, Florida 33309.

Article XIII - Amendment

The Corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation, or any amendment hereto, and any right conferred upon the shareholders is subject to this reservation.
