ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

DOCTORS INLET PEDIATRICS, P.A.

The undersigned natural persons, each of whom is licensed or otherwise legally authorized to perform the service of medical treatment in the State of Florida, hereby associate themselves with the intention of forming a professional corporation in accordance with the Florida Professional Service Corporation Act, and hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME OF INCORPORATOR

The name of this corporation is DOCTORS INLET PEDIATRICS, P.A.

ARTICLE II

TERM OF EXISTENCE

The date when corporate existence shall commence shall be the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation by the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida and the corporation shall have perpetual existence thereafter.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

This corporation is organized for the following purposes:

- A. To engage in the practice of medicine as a professional corporation and to own and operate a medical clinic for the purposes of providing medical care and treatment.
- B. To promote medical, surgical and scientific research and knowledge; to furnish related laboratory and clinical services; and to own real and personal property, enter into contracts and engage in any lawful business as necessary for the rendering of such professional services.
 - C. To do everything necessary, proper or convenient for the accomplishment

of any of the purposes set forth in these articles, and to do every other act incidental to the corporate purposes which is not forbidden by the laws of the State of Florida or by the provisions of these articles of incorporation.

- D. To engage in any and all other lawful businesses.
- E. The corporation shall carry out the above purposes only through shareholders who are duly licensed or otherwise legally qualified physicians in the State of Florida.

ARTICLE IV

POWERS

The corporation shall have power to:

- A. To have perpetual succession by its corporate name.
- B. To sue and be sued, complain and defend in its corporate name in all actions and proceedings.
- C. To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed, affixed, or in any other manner reproduced.
- D. To purchase, take, receive, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use, and otherwise deal in and with real or personal property or any interest therein, wherever situated.
- E. To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.
- F. To lend money to and use its credit to assist its officers and employees to the full extent permitted by law.
- G. To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory,

governmental district, or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.

- H. To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises, and income.
- I. To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.
- J. To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by the Florida General Corporation Act within or without the State of Florida.
- K. To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation and define their duties and fix their compensation.
- L. To make and alter bylaws, not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation and the laws of this state, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.
- M. To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes.
- N. To transact any lawful business which the board of directors shall find will be an aid of governmental policy.
- O. To pay pensions and establish pension plans, and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officers, and employees and for any or all of the directors, officers, and employees of its subsidiaries.
- P. To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise.
- Q. To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

ARTICLE V

CAPITAL STOCK

This corporation shall have the authority to initially issue FIVE HUNDRED (500) shares of common stock. The aggregate number of shares the corporation is authorized to issue is FIVE THOUSAND (5,000) shares of common stock inclusive of the initial issue of FIVE HUNDRED (500) shares, all with a par value of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) each share. The corporation is authorized to issue only one class of stock, and all issued stock shall be held of record by not more than twenty-five (25) persons.

ARTICLE VI

INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of this corporation in the State of Florida will be 100 West Call Street, Starke, Florida 32091, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Phyllis M. Rosier.

ARTICLE VII

PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The mailing address of the Principal Office is 1537 Waterbridge Court, Orange Park, Florida 32003. The proposed physical address of the Principal Office is 2569 C.R. 220, Suite 204, Doctors Inlet, Middleburg, Florida 32068.

ARTICLE VIII

DIRECTORS

The corporation shall have two directors initially. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time in the manner provided for in the bylaws of the corporation, provided that the corporation shall always have at least one director. The method of election of directors shall be set forth in the bylaws of the corporation. INDEMNIFICATION

The corporation shall indemnify to the full extent permitted by law any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, incorporator, officer, employee or agent of the corporation, against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in connection with such action, suit or proceeding. Such right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such director or officer may be entitled, under the bylaw, agreement, vote of shareholders or otherwise.

ARTICLE XI

PREEMPTIVE RIGHTS

Each shareholder of this corporation shall have the first right to purchase shares (and securities convertible into shares) of any class, kind or series of stock in this corporation that may from time to time be issued (whether or not presently

authorized), including shares from the treasury of this corporation, in the ratio that the number of shares he holds at the time of the issue bears to the total number of shares then outstanding, exclusive of treasury shares. This right shall be deemed waived by any shareholder who does not exercise it and pay for the shares preempted within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice in writing from the corporation stating the prices, terms and conditions of the issue of shares and inviting him to exercise his preemptive rights. This right may also be waived by affirmative written waiver submitted by the shareholder to the corporation within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice from the corporation.

ARTICLE XII

REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

The shareholders of this corporation shall be entitled to remove any director from office at any time for any reason whatsoever, whether or not there is cause for removal.

ARTICLE XIII

<u>AMENDMENT</u>

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by law.
