Restated Articles of Incorporation

of Client Intellect, Inc.

The restatement requires shareholder approval, and that approval was given the shareholders on 15 May 2007.

- I. The name of the Corporation is Client Intellect, Inc.
- II. The principal office and mailing address of the Corporation in the State of Florida is located at 100 East Pine Street, Suite 407, Orlando, in Orange County, Florida 32801.
- III. The location and address of the Corporation's initial registered office in this State is 100 East Pine Street, Suite 407, Orlando, in Orange County, Florida 32801. The initial registered agent at the registered office is Eric L. Pratt.
- IV. The nature of the business of the Corporation and its purposes or activities are to acquire, maintain, develop, rent, use, mortgage, and dispose of real property and interests; receive, purchase, acquire, own, pledge, dispose of, and deal in shares of capital stock, rights, bonds, debentures, notes, trust receipts and other securities, obligations, choses in action, and evidences of indebtedness or interest issued or created by any corporations, associations, firms, trusts, or persons, public or private; acquire and pay for, in cash, stock, bonds, or other securities of the Corporation or otherwise, the goodwill, rights, assets, and property of any person, firm, association, or Corporation; enter into, make, and perform contracts of every kind; borrow money and issue, accept, endorse, and execute promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures, and other negotiable or non-negotiable instruments and evidences of indebtedness; lend any of its funds, either with or without security; acquire, hold, and dispose of shares of its own capital stock and the rights thereto; carry on any other lawful business for which a corporation may be organized under the laws of Florida, including but not limited to providing web-hosting and computer-related services to its patrons and customers; carry out all or any part of the foregoing purposes as principal or agent; do all such things as are necessary and incidental to the attainment of the above-stated purposes; and have and exercise all the powers conferred upon corporations by the laws of the State of Florida.
- V. A. The total number of shares that this Corporation is authorized to issue is one hundred (100) shares of common stock, each share having the par value of one and 00/100 dollar (\$1.00).
- B. No shareholder shall have any preemptive right to subscribe to or purchase any additional shares of any class, or any bonds or convertible securities of any nature; provided, however, that the Shareholders or the Board of Directors may, in authorizing the issuance of shares of stock of any class, confer preemptive right that they or it may deem advisable in connection with such issuance.
- C. The Shareholders or the Board of Directors may authorize the issuance from time to time of shares of its stock of any class, whether now or hereafter authorized, or securities convertible into shares of its stock of any class, whether now or hereafter authorized, for such consideration as they may deem advisable, subject to such restrictions or limitations, if any, that may be set forth in the Bylaws.
- D. Pursuant to this Section, the Shareholders or the Board of Directors may, by amended or Restated Articles of Incorporation, classify or reclassify any unissued stock from time to time by setting or changing the preferences, conversions or other rights, voting powers, restrictions, limitations as to dividends, qualifications, or term or conditions of redemption of the stock, so

- long as such modifications do not adversely affect the Corporation's Subchapter S status, if the Corporation chooses to elect Subchapter S election.
- VI. The Corporation was sufficiently and properly capitalized for its inception and daily business activities, and the records of which can be found in the Corporate office.
- VII. A. The name and mailing address of the incorporator is: Eric L. Pratt, 12472 Lake Underhill Road, #347, Orlando, Florida 32828. The Shareholders or the Board may elect or appoint a President (presently denominated as Eric L. Pratt), one or more Vice Presidents (presently denominated as Eric L. Pratt), a Secretary (presently denominated as Eric L. Pratt), a Treasurer (presently denominated as Eric L. Pratt), and such other officers as it may determine, who shall have such duties and powers as hereinafter provided.
- B. All Corporate activities shall be undertaken by the Board of Directors (but who may allocate or transfer such powers and activities to the Officers hereafter), who will be nominated and approved by the Shareholders at the annual meeting. The name and address of the present Director is Eric L. Pratt, 100 E. Pine Street, #407, Orlando, Florida 32801.
- VIII. In furtherance and not in limitation of the powers conferred by statute, the Board of Directors (Board) shall be expressly authorized and empowered to act for the Corporation as the Corporate Bylaws may allow.
- IX. All of the Corporate property and assets may be sold, leased, or exchanged upon such terms and conditions and for such consideration as the Directors shall deem appropriate for the best interests of the Corporation.
- X. A Corporate Director or Officer shall not be disqualified by his office from dealing or contracting with the Corporation, either as a vendor, purchaser, or otherwise; provided, however, that such transaction or contract is fully disclosed to and thereafter authorized, ratified, or approved by the Directors.
- XI. No person shall be liable to the Corporation for any loss or damage suffered by it on account of any action taken or omitted to be taken by him as a Director or Officer of the Corporation in good faith, and as may be designated by the Bylaws.
- XII. Any Corporate contract, transaction, or act which is approved or ratified by the Directors, or a majority of a quorum of the Shareholders entitled to vote at any meeting, shall be as valid and binding as though approved or ratified by every Corporate Shareholder.
- XIII. The Corporation may adopt By-Laws from time to time, and to provide, <u>inter alia</u>, for the fullest indemnification of its Officers and Directors permitted by the laws of the State of Florida. The Corporation may also purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Corporate Director or Officer of the Corporation.
- ${\sf XIV.}$ Meetings of Shareholders, Officers, or Directors may be held outside the State of Florida.
- XV. The Corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provision contained in these Restated Articles of Incorporation, and in any manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute.
- XVI. Whenever a vote of Shareholders, Officers, or Directors at a meeting thereof is required or permitted to be taken in connection with any Corporate action, the meeting and vote may be dispensed with if such number of Shareholders or Directors

who, if voting, could have authorized such action consent at any time to such Corporate action being taken.

XVII. The regular (including annual) meetings of the Corporation shall be held on the first (1st) business day following the Corporation's annual incorporation date (Date), or as soon thereafter as a meeting may be properly scheduled by the Directors and Shareholders. Special meetings may be held as noted in the Bylaws.

XVIII. Any Shareholder entitled to vote at any meeting may authorize another person or persons to act for him by Proxy. The Proxy must be signed by the Shareholder or his attorney-in-fact, and no Proxy shall be valid after the expiration of eleven (11) months from the date thereof, unless otherwise provided in the Proxy.

XIX. The Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Shareholders, and shall hold office until the next Annual Meeting.

XX. The Corporation shall at all times keep correct minutes, books, and records of account.

 ${\sf XXI.}$ The Corporate seal shall be circular in form, and shall bear the name of the Corporation and the year of its organization.

XXII. The fiscal year shall begin the first (1st) day of January of each calendar year.

XXIII. The Corporation may, at any time, and via appropriate Resolution, authorize that the Corporate Shareholders, Officers, or Directors have full authority to exercise all corporate powers contemplated in these Restated Articles, or as otherwise may be provided by Florida law or statute.

XXIV. The Corporation may elect to be an S Corporation, as provided in Sub-Chapter S of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
