## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION 2003 AUG -6 PM 1: 53 OF NEUROLOGY INSTITUTE OF MELBOURNE, PAPLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

The undersigned incorporator makes and files with the Department of State of the State of Florida these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a professional association under the laws of the State of Florida.

#### ARTICLE I Name

The name of this corporation shall be NEUROLOGY INSTITUTE OF MELBOURNE, P.A.

### ARTICLE II Term of Existence

This corporation shall commence effective upon execution of these Articles and shall have perpetual existence.

### ARTICLE III Principal Office/Mailing Address

The principal office and mailing address of the corporation shall be 116 Silver Palm Avenue, Melbourne, Florida 32901 until such time as the corporation notifies the Department of State of the State of Florida of any change.

### ARTICLE IV Nature of Business

The general nature of the activities of this Professional Association shall be:

- A. To engage solely and specifically in the business of rendering professional medical services that are customarily provided by licensed physicians under the laws of the State of Florida.
- B. To invest the funds of this corporation in real estate, mortgages, stocks, bonds or any other type of investment, and to own real and personal property necessary for the rendering of such professional services.
- C. To do anything necessary and proper for the accomplishment or furtherance of any of the purposes or objects of this corporation enumerated in these Articles of Incorporation, or any amendment thereto, necessary or incidental to the protection and benefit of this corporation; and in general, either alone or in association with other corporations, firms or individuals, to carry on any lawful pursuit necessary or incidental to the accomplishment or furtherance of such purposes or objects of this corporation.

D.
