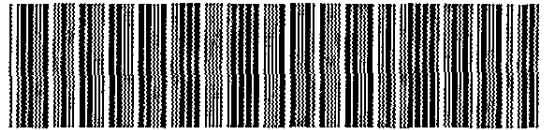



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

TED PALIN CARPENTRY, INC.

ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation shall be TED PALIN CARPENTRY, INC..

ARTICLE II.

The principal office of the corporation is to be located at 46 Lillian Springs Road, Quincy, Gadsden County, Florida 32351, with the privilege of having branch offices at other addresses and places within or without the State of Florida.

ARTICLE III.

The general character or nature of the business and the obligations and purposes to be transacted, promoted and carried on are to do any and all the things herein mentioned, as freely and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and in any part of the world, to-wit:

(a) To conduct and carry on the business of carpentry and contracting for the purpose of repairing, altering, improving, building or erecting structures or buildings of any kind or nature, and generally to do and perform any and all work as a residential contractor and builder and any business connected therewith.

(b) To buy, sell, mortgage, exchange, lease, hold for investment or otherwise, use, operate, develop and manage real estate of all kinds, improved or unimproved, and any right or interest therein.

(c) To erect, or cause to be erected, on any lands owned, held, or occupied by the corporation, buildings or other structures, public or private, with their appurtenances, and to manage, operate, lease, rent, rebuild, enlarge, alter, or improve any buildings or other structures, now or hereafter erected on any lands so owned, held, or

occupied, and to encumber or dispose of any lands, or interests in lands, and any buildings or other structures, at any time owned or held by the corporation.

(d) To acquire, by purchase, lease, manufacture, or otherwise, any personal property deemed necessary or useful in the equipping, furnishing, improvement, development or management of any property, real or personal, at any time owned, held, or occupied by the corporation, and to invest, trade, and deal in any personal property deemed beneficial to the corporation, and to lease, rent, encumber or dispose of any personal property at any time owned or held by the corporation.

(e) To contract debts and borrow money, issue and sell or pledge bonds, debentures, notes and other evidence of indebtedness, and execute such mortgages, transfers of corporate property, or other instruments to secure the payment of corporate indebtedness as required.

(f) To purchase the corporate assets of any other corporation and engage in the same or other character of business.

(g) To guarantee, endorse, purchase, hold, sell, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise acquire or dispose of the shares of the capital stock of, or any bonds, securities, or other evidence of indebtedness created by any other corporation of the State of Florida or any other state or government, and while owner of such stock to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote such stock.

(h) To enter into, make, perform, and carry out contracts and agreements of every kind, for any lawful purpose, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association, or corporation; and to transact any further and other business necessarily connected with the purposes of this corporation, or calculated to facilitate the same.

(i) To carry on any or all of its operations and businesses, and to promote its objects within the State of Florida or elsewhere, without restriction as to place or amount; and to have, use, exercise and enjoy all of the general powers of like corporations.

(j) To engage in any and all lawful businesses, trades, occupations and professions.

(k) To do any or all of the things herein set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and in any part of the world as principals, agents, contractors, or otherwise, alone, or in company with

others, and to do and perform all such other things and acts as may be necessary, profitable, or expedient in carrying on any of the business or acts above-named.

(1) The intention is that none of the objects and powers as hereinabove set forth, except where otherwise specified in this Article, shall be in anywise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other objects, powers, or clauses of this Article or any other Articles; but that the objects and powers specified in each of the clauses in this Article shall be regarded as independent objects and powers.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be ONE THOUSAND (1,000) shares of common stock with a par value of One (\$1.00) Dollar per share. All of said stock shall be paid for in cash, property, labor or services at a just valuation to be fixed by the Board of Directors of this corporation at any regular or special meeting.

ARTICLE IV.

This corporation shall have two (2) directors initially. The number of directors may be increased or diminished from time to time by the by-laws, but shall never be less than one (1).

ARTICLE V.

The names and addresses of the first Board of Directors, who, unless otherwise provided by the Articles of Incorporation or the by-laws, shall hold office for the first year of existence of the corporation or until their successors are elected or appointed and having qualified, shall be as follows:
