ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned incorporator to these Articles of Incorporation, natural person(s) competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the Laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation shall be: JOE GATT ENTERPRISES, INC.

ARTICLE II - NATURE OF BUSINESS

The general nature of the business and the object and purpose to be transacted and carried on are to do any and all of the things herein mentioned, as fully and to do the same to the same extent as natural persons might or could so, viz:

To engage in and carry on any business activities permitted under the laws of the United States and the State of Florida.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold lands, buildings and tenements for the offices and premises of the corporation, and to lease, mortgage and convey such real estate in such manner as may appear for the best interest of the corporation.

Sue and be sued and appear and defend in all actions and proceedings in its corporate name to the same extent as natural person.

Adopt and use a common corporation seal and alter the same.

Appoint such officers and agents as its affairs shall require and allow them suitable compensation.

Acquire, enjoy and utilize and dispose of patents, copyrights and trademarks and any licenses or other rights or interests thereunder or therein. Take, hold, sell, and convey such property as may be necessary in order to obtain or secure payment of any indebtedness or liability to it.

Contract debts and borrow money at such rates of interest not to exceed the lawful interest rate and upon such terms as it or its board of directors may deem necessary or expedient and shall authorize or agree upon, issue and sell or pledge bonds, debentures, notes and other evidence of indebtedness, whether secure or unsecured, and execute such mortgages, or other instruments upon or encumbering its property or credit to secure the payment of money borrowed or owing by it, as occasion may require and the board of directors deem expedient.

ARTICLE III - CAPITAL STOCK

ARTICLE XI - TRANSACTIONS OF INTERESTED DIRECTORS

In the event that the corporation enters into contracts or transacts business with one or more of its directors, or with any firm of which one or more of its directors are members or employees, or with any other corporation or association of which one or more of its directors are shareholders, directors, officers, or employees, such contract shall not be invalidated or in any way affected by the fact that such director or directors have or may have interests therein which might be adverse to the interests of the corporation, even though the vote for the director or directors having such adverse interests shall have been necessary to obligate the corporation upon such contract or obligation provided, however, that in any such case, the fact of such interest shall be disclosed to the other directors or shareholders acting upon or in reference to such contract or transaction.
