ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF MIKE'S PIES & GIFTS, INC.

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Florida Business Corporation Act, adopts the following articles of incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

Name

ARTICLE II

Initial Principal Office and Mailing Address

The Corporation's initial principal office and mailing address is 201 N. Franklin Street, Suite 2000, Tampa, FL 33602.

ARTICLE III Sha<u>res</u>

The Corporation shall have authority to issue ten million (10,000,000) shares of common stock, with a par value of \$.001 per share, 100,000 of which shall be voting shares, and 9,900,000 of which shall be non-voting shares. Except for the difference in voting rights, all shares of common stock shall have the same rights.

ARTICLE IV Initial Registered Agent and Office

The street address of the Corporation's initial registered office is 201 N. Franklin Street, Suite 2000, Tampa, Florida 33602, and the name of the Corporation's initial registered agent at that address is James W. Goodwin, Esq.

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ARTICLE VI Board of Directors

A. <u>Initial Board of Directors</u>. The names and addresses of the initial directors of the Corporation are:

- B. Number and Term. The Board of Directors shall be composed of no less than one (1) member who shall be elected at the annual meeting of shareholders to be held at the time and place prescribed in the By-Laws. The exact number of directors may be fixed by the By-Laws or by the shareholders. Directors need not be shareholders of the Corporation. They shall hold office after their election for a period of one year or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, subject to their resignation or their removal by the shareholders at any time with or without cause. The initial members of the Board of Directors, as named in this Article, shall hold office for the first year of existence of the Corporation or until their respective successors are duly elected and qualified.
- C. <u>Powers and Duties</u>. Included among the powers and duties of the Board of Directors are the following:
 - (I) electing the officers of the Corporation;
- (2) exercising complete charge of the business of the Corporation, including electing committees of the Board and delegating to them, as well as to the officers of the Corporation, such powers in the conduct of the Corporation's business as may be deemed advisable:
- (3) determining the compensation of the officers, including those who may also be directors; and
- (4) specifying the conditions upon which certificates representing shares of the Corporation shall be issued, and replacing lost or destroyed certificates by a new issue.

ARTICLE VII Officers

- A. Officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, Secretary and Treasurer, as well as such other officers as the Board of Directors may deem advisable.
 - B. Officers need not be shareholders of the Corporation.

- C. All officers shall have rank, tenure of office, powers and duties as may be prescribed by the By-Laws or the Directors by appropriate resolution.
- D. The names and office of each of the first officers, each of whom shall hold office for the first year of the Corporation's existence or until their respective successors are duly elected and qualified, are:

ARTICLE VIII Indemnification

No director of the Corporation shall be personally liable to the Corporation or its shareholders for monetary damages for any statement, vote, decision, or failure to act, regarding corporate management or policy, as a director, except to the extent that such exemption from liability or limitation thereof is not permitted under the Florida Business Corporation Act. If the Florida Business Corporation Act is amended after the filing of these Articles of Incorporation of which this Article VIII is a part to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors or officers, then the liability of directors and officers of the Corporation shall be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by the Florida Business Corporation Act as so amended.

The Corporation shall indemnify to the fullest extent permitted by law, whether currently existing or arising in the future, any person who is made, or is threatened to be made, a party to any action, suit or proceeding (whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director or officer of the Corporation or serves or served as a director of officer of any other enterprises at the request of the Corporation.

Any repeal or modification of the foregoing paragraphs of this Article VIII by the shareholders of the Corporation shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director or officer of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.
