ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Peter A. Okubo, PA

THE UNDERSIGNED SUBSCRIBER TO THESE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION, COMPETENT AS AN INCORPORATOR PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 607.0201 FLORIDA STATUTES, DESIRING TO ASSOCIATE FOR THE PURPOSE OF FORMING A CORPORATION, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 607, FLORIDA GENERAL CORPORATION ACT, AND PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATUTES OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA PROVIDING FOR THE FORMATION, LIABILITIES, PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES OF A CORPORATION FOR PROFIT, DOES HEREBY CERTIFY AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I - NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of this corporation is, and shall be: Peter A. Okubo, PA

ARTICLE II - NATURE OF BUSINESS

This corporation may engage in any activity or business permitted under the laws of the United States and of this State. Anesthesiologist, MR.

ARTICLE III - CAPITAL STOCK

The maximum number of shares of stock that this corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any one time is One Thousand (1,000) shares of Common Stock at \$1.00 par value.

ARTICLE VIII - OFFICERS

The officers of this Corporation shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, and a Treasurer, each of who shall be elected by the Board of Directors in the manner and at the time prescribed in the By-Laws of this Corporation. Such other officers and assistant officers and agents as may be deemed necessary, may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors or chosen in such other manner as may be prescribed by the By-Laws. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person.

ARTICLE IX - INDEMNIFICATION

The Corporation shall indemnify all directors, officers or authorized agents of the Corporation who is a party of is threatened to be made a party to any litigation or legal proceeding, whether civil or criminal, administrative or investigative, arising from the fact that such person is a director, officer or authorized agent of the Corporation, against all expenses, attorney's fees, (including appellate proceedings), judgments, fines and, subject to obtaining the prior written consent of the corporation, amounts paid in settlement as well as costs reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with such litigation or proceeding, unless (a) a court of competent jurisdiction finally determines, after all appeals are exhausted of is such appeal is not pursued by the proposed indemnitee, that he or she did not act in good faith or in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that he or she had reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was lawful, and (b) such court also determines specifically tat indemnification should be denied under the underlying circumstances giving rise to such proceedings. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgement, order, settlement or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that a person seeking indemnification did not act in good faith and in a manner which he or she reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the corporation, and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding had reasonable

cause to believe that his or her conduct was not unlawful.

B. Expenses. 
