ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

BIRD'S PAINTING & PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, INC.

THE UNDERSIGNED, on behalf of a duly qualified painter in the State of Florida desiring to form a Professional Corporation in accordance with Chapter 607 and/or 621, F.S. (Profit) of the Florida Statues hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this Corporation she be BIRD'S PAINTING & PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, INC.

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PRINCIPLE OFFICE

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

The purpose for which the Corporation is organized shall be to engage in and provide painting and property maintenance services within the State of FL, and to do those things that are necessary or proper in connection with that practice including, but not limited to, the following:

A. To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, to own, hold and operate, and to sell, mortgage, pledge, lease, employ, or otherwise dispose of, encumber, or invest in such real estate, mortgages, stocks, bonds, and all types of personal property, tangible or intangible, as may be reasonably required in the conduct of its professional business and in connection with any other proper business activity in which the Corporation may engage.

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- B. To enter into and make all necessary contracts for the conduct of its professional business with any person, partnership, association, corporation, or other entity, and to perform, carry out, cancel and rescind those contracts.
- C. To borrow or raise money reasonably required in the conduct of its professional business and in connection with any proper business activity in which the Corporation may be engaged; and to execute and deliver any instruments that may be necessary to evidence the borrowing.
- D. To form and become a participant in any partnership, limited partnership, or joint venture with any individuals, firms, corporations, or entities, and to become a shareholder in any corporation for profit, and to become a member of any association, nonprofit corporation or other entity.
- E. To carry on any other business in connection with and incidental to any of the foregoing businesses, transactions, and dealings; and to do any other act legal under the laws of the State of Florida with all the powers conferred on corporations by the laws of the State of Florida.
- F. To restrict the manner in which the persons to whom its capital stock shall be issued or transferred and to enact bylaws to carry these restrictions into effect.
- G. To do everything necessary, proper, advisable, or convenient for the accomplishment focusing on the corporate purpose or the attainment of any of the objectives or the furtherance of any of the powers set forth in these Articles of Incorporation, incidental to, pertaining to, or growing out of its professional business or otherwise, and at all times to comply with the provisions of the Florida Professional Corporation Act a currently enacted and as may be hereafter amended or suspended by any other statute.

ARTICLE IV

SHARE STRUCTURE

- 7.1 The maximum number of shares that the Corporation is authorized to have outstanding is one thousand (1,000) shares. All shares shall be common with a par value of one dollar (\$1.00) per share.
- 7.2 No share of stock of this Corporation shall be issued or transferred to any person who is not a licensed physical therapist.
- 7.3 The Board of Directors is hereby authorized to fix and however created or arising, shall be used, declared in dividends, or paid to

shareholders, and without action by the shareholders, to use the surplus, or any part thereof, as is permitted by corporate law, for the purchase or acquisition of shares, voting trust certificates for shares, bonds, debentures, notes, scrip, warrants, obligations, evidences of indebtness or other securities of the Corporation.

7.4 To the extent permissible under the laws of the State of Florida, consent by the vote or otherwise of the holes of shares (of any class entitled to vote thereon) entitling them to exercise a majority of the voting power of the Corporation shall be sufficient to sustain any action to be taken by the shareholders of the Corporation, and in cases where any class shall be required by laws of the state of Florida to consent separately as a class, consent by vote or otherwise of the holders of a majority of the shares of that class shall be sufficient to sustain any action to be taken by the shareholders of that class.

ARTICLE V

INITIAL DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

A director or officer of the Corporation shall not be disqualified by office from dealing or contracting with the Corporation as a vendor, purchaser, employee, agent, or otherwise. No act of the Corporation shall be void or voidable or in any way affected by reason of the fact that any director of officer of this shareholder, or trustee or a corporation; trustee or beneficiary of a trust; or otherwise connected with any other enterprise that is in any way interested in the act.

No director or officer shall be accountable or responsible to the Corporation of or in respect to any act of the Corporation for any gains or profits directly or indirectly realized by reason of the fact that the Director or officer or any firm of which he or she is a member; any corporation of which her or she is an officer, shareholder, director, or trustee; any rust of which he or she is connected is interested in the act. The fact that the director of officer, or that the firms, corporation, trust of other entity is interested shall be disclosed or shall have been known to the Board of Directors at which action in respect to any such transaction; and any interested director may vote to authorize. ratify, or approve the transaction. Any officer of the Corporation may take any action within the scope of his or her authority, respecting any act, with like force and effect as if he or she, or any other entity with which her or he is connected, were not interested in the act. Without limiting or qualifying the foregoing, if in any judicial or other inquiry, suit, cause or proceeding, the question is whether a director or officer of the Corporation has acted in good faith is material, and notwithstanding any statute or rule of law or of equity to the contrary (if there is any) his or her good faith shall be presumed, in the absence of clear and convincing evidence and proof to the contrary.

DURATION

ARTICLE IX

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

The professional services of the Corporation shall be rendered only through officers, employees, and agents who are legally authorized within the State of Florida pursuant to Florida Statues. Professional services shall be rendered in each case by the officer, employee, or agent designated solely by this Corporation, acting through its duly elected officers, and no officer, employee, or agent shall enter into any contact, written or verbal, for professional services.

STATED CAPITAL

The amount of capital with which the Corporation shall begin business is five hundred dollars (\$500.00)

ARTICLE XII

AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES

The Corporation reserves the right at any time, and from time to time, to amend these Articles of Incorporation in the manner now or hereafter permitted by statute. Any change authorized by the holders of the shares entitling them to exercise a majority of the voting power of the Corporation (or such greater number as may then be required by statue), shall be binding and conclusive on every shareholder of the Corporation as fully as if each withstanding that her or she may have voted against the amendment or may have objected in writing, shall be entitled to payment of the fair cash value of his or her shares or any other rights of a dissenting shareholder.

ARTICLE XIII

INDEMNFICATION

11.1 The corporation shall indemnify each of its officers, directors, and employees, whether or not then in office, and his or her heirs and legal representatives against all expenses, judgments, decrees, fines, penalties, or other amounts paid in satisfaction of, in settlement of, or in connection with the defense of any pending or threatened action, suite or proceeding, civil or criminal, to which he or she is or may be made a party by reason of having been a director, officer, or employee of the Corporation. Without limitation, the term "expenses" shall include all counsel fees, expert witness fees, court costs, and any other costs of similar nature. The corporation shall not, however, indemnify any officer, director, or employee until a majority of all directors, that the officer, director, or employee:

- (a) Was not grossly negligent in his or her duty to the Corporation, nor guilty of intentional misconduct in the performance of duties to the Corporation;
- (b) Acted in good faith in what her or she reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Corporation; and
- (c) In any matter subject to criminal action, suite or proceeding had no reasonable cause to believe that the conduct was unlawful.

In making this determination, all of the directors, including any director who is party to or threatened with action, su9ite, or proceeding, shall be entitled to vote at the meeting or to sign the written instrument and thereby be counted for all purposes in determining a majority of the Board of Directors.

11.2 Any officer, director, or employee who is entitled to indemnification from the Corporation may make a written demand on the Board of Directors, by serving the written demand o the President of the Secretary (unless the President and Secretary are both making the demand, in which case services may be made on any other officer of the Corporation). If the Board of Directors does not, within sixty (60) days after service of the written demand, determine that the officer, director or employee demand, apply to a court of general jurisdiction in the county in which the Corporation maintains its principal officer, to consider the matters referred to in Subparagraphs (a), (b), (c) of Paragraph 11.1. If the court determines that the conduct of the officer, director or employee was such as to meet the requirements in the subparagraphs, the court shall order the Corporation to indemnify the officer, director, or employee to the same extent as if the Board of Directors had originally made the determination.

ARTICLE XIV

SEVERENCE AND TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

If any officer, director, or stockholder, agent or employee of this Corporation becomes legally disqualified to render the professional services for which the Corporation is organized, or accepts employment that places restrictions or limitations on this continued rendering of such professional services, he shall not thereafter participate or share, directly or indirectly, in any earnings or profits realized by the Corporation on account of professional services. The Corporation shall forthwith, upon such disqualification of any shareholder, purchase such shareholder's shares and pay him all amounts owing and lawfully due to him by the Corporation, except that such shares shall not be entitled to dividends.

ARTICLE XV

INFORMAL DIRECTOR ACTION

If all of the Directors severally or collectively consent in writing to any action taken or to be taken by the Corporation, and the writing evidencing their consent are filed with the Secretary of the Corporation, the action shall be valid as though it has been authorized at a meeting of the Board of Directors.
