ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned subscriber to the articles of incorporation, who is a matural persons of the undersigned subscriber to the articles of incorporation, who is a matural persons of the State of Florida competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida as follows:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation is **SOUTHFARM CORPORATION**

ARTICLE II - TERMS OF EXISTENCE

This corporation shall commence to exist on the date of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation and shall have perpetual existence thereafter.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

ARTICLE IV - POWERS

The corporation shall have the power:

- (a) To have perpetual succession by its corporation name.
