It has been brought to the attention of this office that UNIVERSAL P & C, INS. INC, is not located at 8530 S.W. 124 AVE, SUITE 139 MIAMI, FL 33183, as listed on the records of the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations.

Therefore, the purpose of this notice is to: 1.) notify the owner of the Corporation of the incorrect data; and 2.) notify the owner that it is a third degree felony to knowingly and willingly falsify or conceal a material fact or make any false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement in any matter within the jurisdiction of the Florida Department of State. Therefore, the information must be corrected on our records to avoid any further action by this office. We can change the Principal, Mailing and Officer/Director addresses at no charge, but the Registered Agent's address requires an Amendment and fee of \$35.00 and I will enclose that form for you to complete and return to my immediate attention. This business entity will be dissolved/revoked on or after January 7, 2014 unless an address change that complies with Florida Statutes is sent to my attention at the address below.

Florida Statutes 48.091(1) Every Florida Corporation and every foreign corporation now qualified or hereafter qualifying to transact business in this state shall designate a registered agent and registered office in accordance with Chapter 607.

(2) Every corporation shall keep the registered office open from 10 a.m. to 12 noon each day except Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, and shall keep one or more registered agents whom process may be served at the office during these hours. The corporation shall keep a sign posted in the office in some conspicuous place designating the name of the corporation and the name of its registered agent whom process may be served.

Florida Statutes 48.031(6) If the only address for a person to be served, which is discoverable through public records, is a private mailbox, substitute service may be made by leaving a copy of the process with the person in charge of the private mailbox, but only if the process server determines that the person to be served maintains a mailbox at that location.
