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

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

CHARLES P. COX, C.P.A., P.A.

The undersigned subscriber to these articles of incorporation, a natural person competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this corporation is:

CHARLES P. COX, C.P.A., P.A.

ARTICLE II. NATURE OF BUSINESS

The general nature of the business to be transacted is:

1. To engage in every aspect and phase of the business of practicing certified public accounting and to engage in every aspect and phase of all lawful business.
2. To invest and reinvest in real, tangible and intangible property.
3. To conduct its business of the practice of certified public accounting, have one or more offices, and buy, hold, mortgage, sell, convey, lease or otherwise dispose of real and personal property in the State of Florida.
4. To contract debts and borrow money, issue notes and other evidences of indebtedness, and execute such mortgages, transfers of corporate property, or other instruments to secure the payment of corporate indebtedness as required.
5. The foregoing clauses shall be construed both as purposes and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that the foregoing enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of the corporation.

ARTICLE III. CAPITAL STOCK

The maximum number of shares of stock that this corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any one time is 10,000 shares of common stock having a par value of \$1.00 per share. Stock in this corporation can be owned and held only by an eligible stockholder, which shall include

only a certified public accountant, another professional corporation or professional limited liability company owned entirely by certified public accountants, as required under Chapter 621, Florida Statutes. The consideration to be paid for each share shall be as fixed by the board of directors, and may take the form of services rendered, cash, property, or any other form deemed satisfactory by the board of directors.

ARTICLE IV. INITIAL CAPITAL

The amount of the capital with which this corporation will begin business shall not be less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

ARTICLE V. TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE VI. ADDRESS

The street address of the principal office of the corporation in the State of Florida is 140 South Commerce Avenue, Sebring, FL 33870. The board of directors may from time to time move the principal office to any other address in Florida, and may establish branch offices in such other place or places as may be designated by the board of directors.

ARTICLE VII. DIRECTORS

This corporation shall have one (1) director, initially. The number of directors may be increased or diminished from time to time, by by-laws adopted by the stockholders, but shall never be less than one.

ARTICLE VIII. DIRECTORS' POWERS

The board of directors shall have the power to fix or change salaries of the directors and officers, to restrict the transfer of stock by stockholders, to indemnify directors and officers against liability for their good faith acts and omissions, to permit contracts or other transactions between the corporation and one or more of its directors individually or businesses in which one or more of its directors are interested, and to exercise such other powers of the corporation as are not inconsistent with these articles or with any by-laws that may be adopted by the stockholders.

The subscriber of these articles of incorporation hereby assigns to this corporation his or her rights under Section 607, Florida Statutes, to constitute a corporation, and he hereby assigns to those persons designated by the board of directors any rights he or she may have as a subscriber to acquire any of the capital stock of this corporation, these assignments becoming effective when these articles of incorporation have been filed with and approved by the Secretary of State of Florida, and the filing fee and filing tax paid to that official.

ARTICLE XI. AMENDMENTS

The corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provision contained in these articles of incorporation in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by law, and all rights conferred on stockholders herein are granted and subject to this reservation. Each amendment submitted to the stockholders for approval must be approved at a stockholders' meeting by a majority of the stock entitled to vote thereon.

ARTICLE XII. REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

The corporation hereby designates as its registered office, 425 South Commerce Avenue, Sebring, FL 33870 and its registered agent, Robert S. Swaine, who is located at the same address for service of process.




