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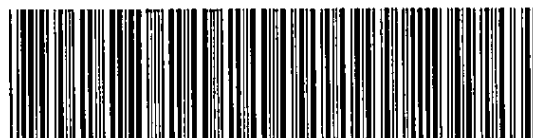

FINAL JUDGMENT OF DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

This cause came before this Court for a hearing on a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage. The Court, having reviewed the file and heard the testimony, makes these findings of fact and reaches these conclusions of law:

1. The Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties.
2. The Petitioner/Wife, LADY GUILLEN-RIVERA, has been a resident of the State of Florida for more than 6 months immediately before filing the Petition for Dissolution of Marriage.
3. The marriage between the parties is irretrievably broken. Therefore, the marriage between the parties is dissolved, and the parties are restored to the status of being single.
4. There are three (3) children of the marriage, to wit:
MATTHEW A. GUILLEN-RIVERA, born March 9, 2008;
MAXIMILIANO A. GUILLEN-RIVERA, born April 22, 2010; and
MICHAELA A. GUILLEN-RIVERA, born September 16, 2014
5. Mediated Marital Settlement Agreement. The parties have voluntarily entered into a Marital Settlement Agreement, which has been filed in this case, along with their respective Family Law Financial Affidavits. Therefore, the Mediated Marital Settlement Agreement is hereby adopted, ratified, and incorporated into this Final Judgment, but not merged herein. The parties are ordered to obey all of its provisions.
6. The Court further finds that the attached Mediated Marital Settlement Agreement incorporated into this Final Judgment constitutes *de facto* compliance with Chapter 61, Florida Statutes 61.13, as amended on October 1, 2008, and includes all of the required child-related components of the parenting plan mandated by the amended Statute, including, *inter alia*, the parties' respective time sharing with the minor child. Any future modification proceedings regarding any of the child-related components of the attached Mediated Marital Settlement Agreement shall be governed by and must comply with the

specific parenting plan requirements of set forth in Chapter 61, Florida Statutes, which became effective October 1, 2008, or with any subsequent amendment(s) to Chapter 61 which may be applicable and in effect as of the date of any such modification proceedings.

7. The Court has jurisdiction over the minor children:
 - a. The United States is the country of habitual residence of the children.
 - b. The State of Florida maintains the most significant contracts with the children and is the most appropriate forum for addressing parenting contact.
 - c. The State of Florida is the children's home state for purposes of the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act and the Parental Kidnapping Prevention Act.
 - d. Venue is proper in Miami-Dade County, Florida.
 - e. The requirements of the International Child Abduction Remedies Act and the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction enacted at The Hague on October 25, 1980, are met.
8. The Court finds that the parties have the present ability to pay support as agreed to in the marital settlement agreement as ratified and made part of this final judgment.
9. The Petitioner's name is hereby restored to: LADY DIANA RIVERA
10. The Court reserves jurisdiction to modify and enforce this final judgment.


