Revenues suffered a further decline from 1999, falling off about 35% to \$135,147. The first half was a continuation of the prior earnings trend, but the second half was very slow, and following September 12 revenues nearly ceased for the duration of the year. There were no law suits or other unusual expenses.

Thirty-two slipmeters were sold, a fall-off of 32% from the prior year. Production of slipmeter parts was continued, and another 50 sets of parts were machined and anodized.

Good progress continued on the standards front. The 1926 regulations for slip resistance of painted fabricated steel components were promulgated with a five-year latency period. The ANSI A1264.2 standard on Provision of Slip Resistance in the Workplace stood another appeal and was promulgated. Reportedly the draft of a slip resistance provision in the NFPA building code fell out, however.

Advertising costs were reduced. The *Professional Safety* ad was reduced to one column inch, and other Web-based advertising was reduced to zero. A three-line classified was initiated in *Trial* near the end of the year, which gained a link from the ATLA Web site to EnglishXL.com.

A British distributor for the *XL* was signed up, and he has sold one unit. A South Korean reseller was also signed up, but so far he has sold nothing.

Opposition to standardization of the *XL* has continued, however two of the most virulent opponents were removed from the arena by Chapter 11 filings in their companies. The ASTM Board of Directors Task Group has accomplished little, though ruggedness testing has been assigned to Underwood and DiPilla. Balloting of a precision and bias statement for F1679 failed, but all other revisions were passed.

Lab testing has continued at a steady pace, and the higher fee schedule appears to have been successfully established. The certification program continues to flourish. There were four more classes, and more than fifty candidates have been certified. Web service was transferred to FL Access and then to OLSUSA during the past year, but continual problems with service continue to nag.

Plans for the New Year are for increased public appearances and conference presentations for the *XL* and the effort to sell the SST Sport Shoe traction Tester.
