

Dear Sir or Madam,

Recently both my insurance agent and CPA had occasion to look up the status of Marshall Stark Construction Inc., due to the latest Workman's Compensation law revision and found it to be inactive. I called and spoke to one of your representatives today and was informed that a dissolution occurred in September 2001. This was a result of your not receiving an annual report or the filing fee, as it happens we had moved to a new location (note above address) on or about April 2001. I've spent all morning going through the files, general paperwork and correspondence from 2000-2003 and do not find the report and application. I can't say for certain that I didn't receive it but I know I sent in the 5 previous years timely. It would seem that I would realize oh about July or August that I had not submitted this year's or last year's reports having sent them previously, but my last employee left in Oct. 2000 and my field duties increased so that between my wife and a part time helper taking over some of the office duties it did not occur to me. In speaking to your representative there was an indication that under these or certain circumstances a waiver might be possible, so that the total reinstatement fee to date would be \$ 450.00. I am sending a check for this amount plus \$ 8.75 for a Certificate of status in hopes that you will grant this waiver, this would be greatly appreciated. I don't know if you know this but the Insurance Industry is going to wipe out the small Contractor's, with their reduction in coverage's and increased premiums. In any event every little bit helps, thank you for your consideration.
