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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

IN "ERNATIONAL EYEWEAR, INC.

The undersigned subscriber to those Articles of Incorporation, a natural person, competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I.

<u>NAME</u>

The name of the corporation shall be: INTERNATIONAL EYEWEAR, INC.

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ARTICLE II.

PURPOSES

The purposes for which the corporation is formed and the business and objects to be carried on and promoted by it are as follows:

(a) To buy, sell, deal in, lease, hold, subdivide, improve and develop real estate; to establish subdivisions, towns, cities and villages and to dedicate lands for ways, roads, streets, alleys, sidewalks, parkways, parks and other purposes; and to engage in, conduct and carry on any business or undertaking for the improvement of property owned by the corporation or in which it may have an interest.

(b) To build, purchase, take, receive, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold, use, maintain, alter, repair and improve, sell,

convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, exchange, transfer and otherwise dispose of automobiles, boats, planes, buildings, structures, works and improvements of all kinds; to plan, establish, furnish, decorate, equip, improve, maintain, lease, sublease, sell, convey, exchange and transfer space, offices, rooms, suites and apartments; and to manufacture, purchase or otherwise acquire, own, use, install, maintain, repair, operate and deal in and with, and sell, mortgage, pledge, lease, or otherwise dispose of fixtures, improvements and furnishings of all kinds and any articles, materials, machinery, equipment and property used for or in connection with any business or property of the corporation.

(c) To borrow money and issue evidence of indebtedness in furtherance of any or all of the objects of its business; to secure the same by mortgage, deeds of trust, pledge or other lien; or the assumption thereof.

(d) To enter into, perform and carry out contracts of any kind necessary to or in connection with or incidental to the accomplishment of any one or more of the purposes of the corporation.

(e) To transact any and all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under Chapter 607, Florida Statutes.

(f) To engage in any and all lawful acts or activities related to any of the above.

ARTICLE III.

CAPITAL STOCK

The maximum number of shares that this corporation is to have outstanding at any one time is 1,000 shares of common stock, having a nominal or par value of \$.50 per share. The consideration to be paid for each share shall be fixed by the Board of Directors, but in no event shall be less than \$.50.

ARTICLE IV.

TERM

This corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE V.

REGISTERED AGENT AND REGISTERED OFFICE

The Registered Agent for the corporation shall be JONATHAN S. ROOT and the Registered Office shall be located at 301 Yamato Road, Suite 3101, Boca Raton, Florida 33431, or such other person or place as the Board of Directors shall from time to time direct, with appropriate notice being given to the Secretary of State in accordance with law.

ARTICLE VI.

DIRECTORS

This corporation shall have not less than 1 nor more than 5 directors, as set forth in the By-Laws. The names and street addresses of the first Board of Directors of this corporation who, subject to these Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws of this corporation, and the laws of the State of Florida, shall hold office

ARTICLE VIII.

SPECIAL PROVISO

Any action by the directors of this Corporation which is within their power taken at a meeting of such directors shall be valid for all intents and purposes whether or not lawful notice of said meeting shall have been given to all directors as required by law or by the By-Laws of this Corporation, if at any time prior to, during or subsequent to such meeting all directors shall execute a waiver of notice of such meeting, in writing, and providing a majority of the directors shall have approved or approve the action taken at such meeting.

When not prohibited by law, any action by the shareholders of this Corporation which is within their power taken at a meeting of such shareholders shall be valid for all intents and purposes whether or not lawful notice of said meeting shall have been given to all shareholders, as required by law or the By- Laws of this Corporation, if at any time prior to, during or subsequent to such mooting all shareholders shall execute a waiver of notice of such moeting in writing and providing a majority of the shareholders shall have approved or approve the action taken at such meeting.

When not prohibited by law, any action of the shareholders of this Corporation may be taken wⁱ⁺hout a meeting if consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all the persons who would be entitled to vote upon such action at a meeting and filed with the Secretary of the Corporation as part of the corporate records. Such const t shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of the shareholders and may be stated as such in any certificate or document filed with the Department of State of the State of Florida or any other governmental agency of any state, county or nation, or with any private organization, corporation, person or persons.

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to allow any act of the Board of Directors to be approved by less than a majority of said directors, or wherever a greater vote is required by law or in the By-Laws by that vote.

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to allow any act of the shareholders to be approved by less than a majority of said shareholders, or wherever a greater vote is required by law or in the By-Laws by that vote.

ARTICLE IX.

INSPECTION OF BOOKS AND RFCORDS

The Corporation shall from time to time determine whether and

to what extent and at what times and places and under what conditions and regulations the accounts and books of the Corporation (other than the stock book) or any of them shall be open to inspection of shareholders; and no shareholder shall have any right to inspect any account, book or document of this Corporation except as conferred by statute, unless authorized by a resolution of the shareholders or the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X.

INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

Every officer and every director of the Corporation shall be indemnified by the Corporation, as permitted by law, against all expenses and liability, including counsel fees, reasonably incurred by or imposed upon him in connection with any proceeding to which he may be a party or in which he may become involved by reason of his being or having been an officer or director of the Corporation, whether or not he is an officer or director at the time such expenses are incurred. The foregoing rights of indemnification shall be in addition to and not exclusive of all other rights to which such officer or director may be entitled.

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ARTICLE XI.

TELEPHONE MEETING AUTHORIZED

Mombers of the Board of Directors or of any executive committee designated by the Board of Directors in accordance with law shall be deemed present at any meeting of the Board of Directors or executive committee, as the case may be, if a conference telephone or similar communications equipment, by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear and be heard by all other persons, is used.

ARTICLE XII.

AMENDMENT

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner and with the provided by law.
