Dear Sir or Madam:

Enclosed please find my client's Application for re-instatement of her corporation. The corporation, Your Daily Care, Inc., was administratively dissolved on September 26, 1997 due to the 1997 annual report not having been filed since it had not been received by my client.

Enclosed please also find a check in the amount of \$315.00 for the 1997 and 1998 annual report fees. I request on behalf of my client that you graciously waive the reinstatement or late penalties due to the overwhelming circumstances surrounding the period of time when she changed the mailing address for the corporation.

When the corporation was initially formed my client's daughter was not only an employee of the corporation but in fact was the only person qualified to operate the computer. My client's daughter ran the marketing aspect of the corporation and was solely responsible for drafting all documents and reports and for preparing all bills in the corporation's paper intensive business. Shortly after establishing their initial foothold in the business in the West Palm Beach market my client's daughter met her untimely demise.

The loss of my client's daughter was devastating on many fronts. Foremost was the emotional trauma which my client, Joy Mizell, suffered such that matters of changing the corporate address paled in comparison. Additionally, and directly pertinent to the issue of waiving any reinstatement penalties, Ms. Mizell now had to face not just learning how to use a computer, but also to exercise her embryonic skills while attempting to keep her business afloat. Unfortunately Ms. Mizell relied upon the U.S. Postal service to continue to forward her mail from last business address.

Ms. Mizell later contracted with two individuals to both maintain and expand her operations and to handle the computer intensive tasks of reporting and billing. These two individuals


were engaged, in part, due to their ability to operate a computer. This computer ability of the new employees alleviated the need for Ms. Mizell to spend her time with such things, and freed her up to service the corporations client's and engage in marketing efforts. Unbeknownst to Ms. Mizell, however, these two individuals had begun to conspire about leaving my client's corporation. In fact they had already begun setting up their own competitor business while still in the employ of Ms. Mizell's corporation. Upon learning of the employees' plans she fired one and the other quit. This, again, left Ms. Mizell all alone, with little if any computer skills and knowledge, to juggle all aspects of the corporation without any assistance. Ms. Mizell now has pared down her business so as to make it more manageable while working alone.

Throughout this time my client was entirely oblivious to the need for filing her corporation's annual report. Not to minimize the importance, but had Ms. Mizell not applied herself to saving her corporation due to devastating incidents, twice, there would be no corporation about which to report. Additionally, Ms. Mizell did in fact provide a forwarding address to the post office so that all mail which went to her old business address should have been forwarded. It was not.

In conclusion, I would like to reiterate my client's request that you accept her enclosed check in the amount of \$315.00 as payment of her 1997 and 1998 annual reporting fees, and further waive any late payments or penalties.
