ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF 1010 OF DUVAL COUNTY, INCORPORATED

The undersigned subscribers to these Articles of Incorporation, each a natural person, competent to contract, hereby associate themselves together to form a corporation under the Florida General Corporation Act.

ARTICLE I - CORPORATE NAME

The name of the corporation is:

1010 OF DUVAL COUNTY, INCORPORATED

ARTICLE II - NATURE OF BUSINESS

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation is: investments in real estate properties and other assets.

To manufacturer, purchase or otherwise acquire, and to own, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of, and to invest in, trade in, deal in and with goods, wares, merchandise, real and personal property, and services of every class, kind and description: except that it is not to conduct a banking, safe deposit, trust, insurance, surety, express, railroad, canal, telegraph, telephone or cemetery, a building and loan association, mutual fire insurance association, cooperative association, fraternal benefit society, state fair or exposition.

To conduct business I have one or more offices in, and buy, hold, mortgage, sell, convey, dispose, lease or otherwise dispose of real and personal property, including franchises, patents, copyrights, trademarks, and licenses, in the State of Florida and in all other states and countries.

To contract debts and borrow money, issue and sell or pledge bonds, debentures, notes and other evidences of indebtedness, and execute such mortgages, transfers of corporate property, or other instruments to secure the payment of corporate indebtedness and engage in the same or

character of business.

To endorse, purchase, hold, sell, transfer, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise acquire or dispose of the share of the capital stock of, or any bonds, securities, or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation of the State of Florida or any other state or government, and while owner of such stock to exercise all rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote such stock.

To become guarantor or surety for any other person, firm, or corporation for any purpose of transaction whatsoever.

To make gifts of its property or cash, either to charitable organizations or otherwise, when deemed in the interest of the company.

To adopt such pension, profit sharing, stock option, and deferred compensation plans for officers, employees and directors and to grant such stock options to officers, employees, directors and others as the directors may deem to be in the interest of the company.

To enjoy all of the powers now and hereafter conferred upon corporations by the statutes and laws of the State of Florida.

The foregoing clauses shall be construed both as objects and powers, the enumeration of which shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers or activities of this corporation which shall have the power to engage in any activity which may be necessary or profitable and generally shall have and enjoy all powers, privileges and immunities of businesses incorporated under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE III - CAPITAL STOCK

The maximum number of shares of stock which this corporation is authorized to have outstanding at any one time is 100 shares.

Such shares shall consist of a single class of common stock and shall have a par value of \$1.00 per share.

ARTICLE IV - INITIAL CAPITAL

The amount of capital with which this corporation will begin business is \$100.00.

ARTICLE V - TERM

This corporation shall exist perpetually unless sooner dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE VI - ADDRESS

The Board of Directors may from time to time move or redesignate this office to any place in Florida.

ARTICLE VII - DIRECTORS

This corporation shall have one director initially. The number of directors may be either increased or diminished from time to time by the By-Laws, but shall never be less than one.

ARTICLE VIII - INITIAL DIRECTORS

ARTICLE X

This corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation, and any right conferred upon the stockholders is subject to this reservation.

The initial By-Laws of this corporation shall be adopted by the Directors. The By-Laws may be amended from time to time by either the stockholders or the directors, but the directors may not alter or amend any By-Law adopted by the stockholders.

Ownership of stock shall not be required to make any person eligible to hold office either as an officer or director of this corporation.

The stockholders may, By-Law provision or by stockholders' agreement, recorded in the minute book, impose such restrictions on the sale, transfer or encumbrance of the stock of this corporation as they may see fit.

Any subscriber or stockholder present at any meeting, either in person or by proxy, and

any director present in person at any meeting of the Board of Directors shall conclusively be deemed to have received proper notice of such meeting unless he shall make objection at such meeting to any defect or insufficiency of notice.

Any contract or other transaction between the corporation and any one or more of its directors, or between the corporation and any firm of which one or more of its directors are members or employees, or in which they are interested, or between the corporation and any corporation or association of which one or more of its directors are shareholders, members, directors, officers, or employees, or in which they are interested, shall be valid for all purposes, notwithstanding the presence of such director or directors at the meeting of the Board of Directors of the corporation, which acts upon, or in reference to such contract or transaction, and notwithstanding his or their participation in such action, if the fact of such interest shall be disclosed or known to the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors shall, nevertheless, authorize, approve or ratify such contract or transactions by a vote of a majority of the directors present, such interested director or directors to be counted in determining whether a quorum is present, but not to be counted in calculating the majority necessary to carry such vote. This section shall not be construed to invalidate any contract or other transaction which would otherwise be valid under the common and statutory law applicable thereto.

The Board of Directors is hereby specifically authorized to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as Directors, and to fix the basis and conditions upon which such compensation shall be paid. Any director of the corporation may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation therefor in any form.

ARTICLE XI

The corporation shall indemnify any director, officer, or employee, or former director,

officer, or employee of the corporation, or any person who may have served at its request as a director, officer, or employee of another corporation in which it owns shares of capital stock, or of which it is a creditor, against expenses actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense of any action, suit or proceeding in which he is made a party by reason of being or having been such director, officer, or employee, except in relation to matters as to which he shall be adjudged in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of duty. The corporation may also reimburse to any director, officer, or employee the reasonable costs of settlement of any such action, suit or proceeding, if it shall be found by the majority of the committee composed of the directors not involved in the matter in controversy (whether or not a quorum) that it was to the interest of the corporation that such settlement be made by that such director, officer, or employee was not guilty of negligence or misconduct. Such rights of indemnification and reimbursement shall not be deemed exclusive to any other rights to which such director, officer or employee may be entitled under any By-Law, agreement, yote or shareholders, or otherwise.
