ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

PRIORITY CONCEPTS, INC.

The undersigned subscribers to these Articles of Incorporation, each a natural person, competent to contract, hereby associates themselves together to form a corporation under the law of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is: Priority Concepts, Inc.

ARTICLE II DURATION

This corporation shall exist perpetually, unless sooner dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

This corporation is organized for the purpose of all matters relating to marketing research and any and all other lawful business permitted under the laws of the United States and the State of Florida necessary to effectuate this.

ARTICLE IV CAPITAL STOCK

This corporation is authorized to issue 100 shares of (\$1.00) par value common stock, which shall be designated "Common Shares".

ARTICLE XI MANAGEMENT OF CORPORATION BY DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

All corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of the Director and the business affairs of this corporation shall be managed under the direction of the Director of this corporation.

ARTICLE XII POWERS

This corporation shall have the corporate power:

(a) To have perpetual succession by its corporate name unless a limited period of duration is stated in its Articles of Incorporation.

(b) To sue and be sued, complain and defend in its corporate

name in all actions or proceedings.

- (c) To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at its pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed, affixed or in any other manner reproduced.
- (d) To purchase, take, receive, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with real or personal property or any interest therein, wherever situated.
- To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange, transfer and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.

To lend money to and use its credit to assist its officers and employees in accordance with the Florida Statutes.

(g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, share or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnership, or individuals, or

direct or indirect obligations of the United States or any other government, state, territory, governmental

municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.

(h) To make contracts and quarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, Issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises and income.

(1) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real personal property as

security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.

To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by this act within or without this state.

(k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation and define their duties and fix their compensation.

(1) To make and alter its By-Laws, not inconsistent with its Articles of Incorporation or with the laws of this State, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.

To make donations for the public welfare or for

charitable, scientific or educational purposes.

- (n) To transact any lawful business which the Board of Directors shall find will be in aid of governmental policy.
 (0) To pay pension and establish pension plans, profit sharing plans, stock bonus plans, stock option plans, and other incentive plans for any and all of its directors, officers and and directors, officers and employees employees of subsidiaries.
- To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, (p) associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

(q) To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient

to effect its purpose.

ARTICLE XIII DIRECTORS RESIDENCY AND COMPENSATION

The residency requirements of the officers and directors is as

If a quorum is present, the affirmative vote of majority of the officers, or if there has been an abstention from voting because of an interest in the matter to be voted upon, the affirmative vote of a majority of the officers present and voting shall be the act of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XV SHAREHOLDERS QUORUM AND VOTING

A majority of the shares entitled to vote, represented in person or by proxy, shall constitute a quorum at a meeting of shareholders.

ARTICLE XVI APPROVAL OF SHAREHOLDERS REQUIRED FOR MERGER

The approval of the shareholders of this corporation to any plan or merger shall be required in every case, whether or not such approval is required by law.

ARTICLE XVII RIGHT OF SHAREHOLDERS TO DISSENT

ARTICLE XXIV REDUCTION OF STATED CAPITAL

The stated capital of this corporation shall not be reduced by action of the Board of Directors where such reduction is not accompanied by any action requiring or constituting an amendment of the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE XXV TRANSACTIONS BETWEEN STOCKHOLDERS AND ITS DIRECTORS

No contract or other transaction between the corporation and any other corporation in the absence of fraud, shall be affected or invalidated by the fact that any one or more of the directors of the corporation is or are interested in, or is a director or officer or are directors or officers of such other corporation, and any director or directors, individually or jointly, may be a party or parties to, or may be interested in such contract or transaction of the corporation or in which the corporation is interested, and no contract, act or transaction of the corporation with any person or persons, firm or corporation in the absence of fraud, shall be
