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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF BRUCE J. CLARK & ASSOCIATES, P.A.

The undersigned hereby executes and acknowledges these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a professional service corporation in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I Name and Principal Office

The name of the corporation shall be Bruce J. Clark & Associates, P.A. The initial principal office and mailing address for the corporation shall be 100 North Tampa Street, Suite 1900, Post Office Box 500, Tampa, Florida 33601-0500.

ARTICLE II Term of Existence

This corporation shall have perpetual existence, commencing on June 13, 1996.

ARTICLE III Nature of Business

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation, and the objects and purposes thereof, shall be as follows:

- (a) To engage solely and specifically in the business of carrying on a general engineering practice.
- (b) To own real and personal property necessary for the rendering of the foregoing professional services; and
- (c) To invest in real estate, mortgages, stocks, bonds, or any other type of investment.

ARTICLE IV Powers

This corporation shall have all powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida upon corporations, including, but not limited to, the power:

- (a) To have perpetual succession by its corporate name;
- (b) To sue and be sued, complain, and defend in its corporate name in all actions or proceedings;

- (c) To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed, affixed, or in any other manner reproduced:

- (c) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge create a security interest in, lease, exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets;
- (f) To lend money to and use its credit to assist its officers and employees to the full extent permitted by law;
- (g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships, or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district, or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof;
- (h) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises, and income;
- (i) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested;
- (j) To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by the laws of the State of Florida within or without this State;
- (k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation and define their duties and fix their compensation;
- (1) To make and alter bylaws, not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation and the laws of the State of Florida, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation;
- (m) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes;

- (n) To transact any lawful business which the Board of Directors shall find will be in aid of governmental policy;
- (o) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, profit sharing plans, stock bonus plans, stock option plans, and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officers, and employees and for any or all of the directors, officers, and employees of its subsidiaries;
- (p) To provide insurance for its benefit on the life of any of its directors, officers or employees, or on the life of any shareholder for the purpose of acquiring at his death shares of its stock owned by the shareholder or by the spouse or children of the shareholder;
- (q) To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise; and
- (r) To have and exercise all other powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

ARTICLE V Capital Stock


