ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Florida Business Corporation Act, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE 1

Corporate Name

The name of the corporation shall be:

AMALIA LANDA-GALINDEZ, M.D. PROFESSIONAL AGSOCIATION

ARTICLE II

Principal Mailing Address

The principal mailing address of this corporation shall be:

ARTICLE III

Nature of Business

This Corporation is being formed for the following purposes:

a. To engage in every phase and aspect of the business of rendering the same professional services to the public that a physician, duly licensed under the laws of the State of Florida, is authorized to render, but such professional services shall be rendered only through officers, employees, and agents who are duly licensed under the laws of the State of Florida to practice medicine therein.

b. To do everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attaining of any of the objects or the furtherance of any of the purposes enumerated in these Articles of Incorporation or any amendment thereof, necessary or incidental to the protection and benefit of the Corporation, and in general, either alone or in association with other corporations, firms, or individuals, to carry on any lawful pursuit necessary or incidental to the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of the objects or the furtherance of such purposes or objects of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV

Duration

This Corporation shall have perpetual existence, unless sooner dissolved in accordance with the law of the State of Florida. The date on which corporate existence shall begin is the date of subscription and acknowledgment of these Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE V

Capital Stock

The maximum number of shares of stock which this corporation is authorized to issue and have outstanding at any one time is One Hundred Thousand (100,000) shares. Such shares shall be of a single class known as Common Stock, and shall have a par value of ONE CENT (\$0.01) per share. None of the shares of the Corporation may be issued to anyone other than an individual duly licensed to practice law in the State of Florida. Shares of Common Stock may be issued in exchange for cash, real property, fixtures and equipment, inventory, accounts receivable, labor or services rendered, or any combination of the foregoing. In absence of fraud in the transaction, the judgment of the Board of Directors as to the value of any such consideration shall be conclusive. share of Common Stock shall be issued in exchange for consideration which is at least equal to the par value thereof, and shall be fully paid and non-assessable. Each share of Common Stock shall entitle the record holder thereof to one vote upon each proposal presented at meetings of the stockholders of the Corporation. Agreements among stockholders regarding the voting of their shares, shall be valid and enforceable in accordance with their terms. No holder of Common Stock shall be entitled to any right of cumulative voting. Record holders of Common Stock are entitled to receive their pro-rata share of any dividends that may be declared by the Board of Directors out of the assets legally available for such purpose. Holders of Common Stock are entitled, in the event of the liquidation or dissolution of this corporation, to receive their pro-rata share of any dividends that may be declared by the Board of Directors out of the assets legally available for such purpose.

ARTICLE VI

Board of Directors

This Corporation shall at all times have at least one (1) director. The stockholders of this Corporation may from time to time, and at any time, increase or diminish the size of the Board of Directors of this Corporation as provided by By-Laws adopted by them, provided that the Corporation shall have at all times a minimum of one (1) director. The By-Laws of this Corporation may provide that the directors be divided into two or more classes whose terms of office shall respectively expire at different times.

ARTICLE VII

Voting Power

No shareholder of the Corporation shall enter into a voting trust agreement or any other type of agreement vesting in another person the authority to exercise the voting power of any or all of his or her shares. Each share of Common Stock shall entitle the holder to one vote on any matter submitted to the holders of the Common Stock for a vote.

ARTICLE VIII

Transfer of Shares

No shareholder of the Corporation may sell or transfer his or her shares therein except to another individual who is eligible to be a shareholder of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IX

Powers

This Corporation shall have all of the corporate powers enumerated in the Florida Professional Service Corporation and Limited Liability Company Act (Chapter 621, Florida Statutes), as amended from time to time.

ARTICLE X

Initial Registered Agent and Registered Office

Conflict of Interest

No contract between this Corporation and another corporation or another individual shall be invalidated by reason of the fact that one or more of the officers or directors of this Corporation are officers or directors of the said other corporation, or by reason of the fact that one or more of the officers or directors of this Corporation may be the other individual or individuals contracting with this Corporation.

ARTICLE XIII

Indemnification

The Corporation shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or contemplated action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that he is or was a director, employee, officer or agent of the Corporation, against expenses (including attorneys' fees and appellate attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, to the full extent permitted by law. The Corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a

director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving, at the request of the Corporation, as a director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against him and incurred by him in any such capacity, or arising out of his status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify him against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XIV

Amendments

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by law. Every amendment shall be approved by the Board of Directors, proposed by them to the Stockholders and approved at the Stockholders' meeting by a majority of the stock entitled to vote thereon, unless all Directors and Stockholders sign a written statement manifesting their intention that certain amendments of these Articles of Incorporation be made.
