I would also submit this letter as a formal request for a waiver of the additional \$600.00 in late fees requested by your office, as they constitute a hardship to Mr. Lawrence under his present circumstances. By way of explanation and mitigation, I offer the following facts for your consideration.

Without elaboration, Mr. Lawrence is in the process of settling a divorce. He has been separated from his wife and two children since the spring of 1998, which necessitated temporary and separate living accommodations and the resulting expenses. Due to these extra costs, and his continuing obligation to support his family, he had to seek employment that offered a more consistent cash flow and better benefits. In March of 1999, he began employment as a construction manager/superintendent. As a result, he was forced to temporarily reduce the operations of Techwood.

In addition to his business obligations, there was also family debt arising from the dissolution. Due the confrontational nature of these proceedings, he did not always receive his mail on time, as his wife "forgot" to inform him that mail was waiting at home. The result was that many bills, correspondence, and other obligations were not timely paid or answered.

At this time, a settlement has been reached and some measure of stability is returning to his life. However, in order to finalize this settlement, Mr. Lawrence has had to assume certain marital debts and other obligations for the benefit of his wife and children, which will continue to be a drain on his resources for the immediate future. This matter is further complicated by the fact that his current

employment project is ending, probably sometime in the next fiscal quarter, which means he must now turn his attention back to rebuilding Techwood.

Mr. Lawrence is aware that of none of these issues or factors excuse his legal obligations but it certainly shows that there were, and continue to be, many mitigating circumstances affecting his life. We only ask that you consider the additional burden imposed by the late payment fee from Mr. Lawrence's perspective and consider his request for waiver.
