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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE NEW MILLENNIUM INTERNATIONAL, INC.

ARTICLES I - NAME

The name of this corporation is THE NEW MILLENNIUM INTERNATIONAL, INC.

ARTICLES II - DURATION

This corporation shall commence on the date of these Articles.

ARTICLES III - PURPOSE

This corporation is organized for the purpose of transacting any and all lawful business, including but not limited to the power:

- To have perpetual succession by its corporate name.
- b) To sue and be sued, complain and defend in its corporate name in all actions or proceedings.
- c) To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at pleasure, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed, affixed, or in any other manner reproduced.
- d) To purchase, take, receive, lesse, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with real or personal property or any interest therein, wherever situated.
- e) To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, create a security interest in, lease, exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all or any part of its property and assets.

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- f) To lend money to, and use its credit to assist, its officers and employees in accordance with Florida Statute 607.141.
- g) To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, use, employ, sell, mortgage, lend, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, and otherwise use and deal in and with, shares or other interests in, or obligations of, other domestic or foreign corporations, associations, partnerships, or individuals, or direct or indirect obligations of the United States or of any other government, state, territory, governmental district, or municipality or of any instrumentality thereof.
- h) To make contracts and guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds, and other obligations, and secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any of its property, franchises and income.
- i) To lend money for its corporate purposes, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested.
- j) To conduct its business, carry on its operations, and have offices and exercise the powers granted by law within or without this state.
- k) To elect or appoint officers and agents of the corporation and define their duties and fix their compensation.
- 1) To make and alter bylaws, not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation or with the laws of Florida, for the administration and regulation of the affairs of the corporation.
- m) To make donations for the public welfare or for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes.
 - n) To transact any lawful business which the Board of Directors shall find will be

in aid of governmental policy.

- o) To pay pensions and establish pension plans, profit sharing plans, stock bonus plans, stock option plans, and other incentive plans for any or all of its directors, officer, and employees and for any or all of the directors, officers, and employees of its subsidiaries.
- p) To be a promoter, incorporator, partner, member, associate, or manager of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise.
 - To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect its purposes.

ARTICLES IV - CAPITAL STOCK

The aggregate number of shares which the Corporation shall have authority to issue is the total sum of 1000 shares, having an individual par value of \$1.00. The consideration to be paid for each share shall be fixed by the Board of Directors. The whole or any part of the capital stock of the said Corporation shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America or property, labor or services at a just valuation to be fixed by the Board of Directors. Property or labor may also be purchased with the capital stock at such valuation as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLES V - FREEMPTIVE RIGHTS

Every shareholder, upon the sale for cash of any new stock of this corporation of the same kind, class or series as that which he already holds, shall have the right to purchase his pro rata share thereof. (as nearly as may be done without issuance of fractional shares) at the price at which it is offered to others.

ARTICLES VI - INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

ARTICLES VII - PRINCIPAL OFFICE
