

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF.

The undersigned subscriber to these Articles of Incorporation, a natural person competent to contract, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the state of Florida.

ARTICLE I

THE NAME OF THIS CORPORATION SHALL BE: Sontouched Vision, Inc.

ARTICLE 11

The general nature of business and the object and purposes to be transacted and carried on are to do any and all the things herein named and mentioned, as fully and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, viz:

ARTICLE X

In the event the corporation enters into contracts or transacts business with one or more of its directors, or with any firm of which one or more or its directors are members or employees, or with any other corporation or association of which one or more of its directors are members or employees, such contracts shall not be invalidated or in any way effected by the

fact that such director or directors have or may have interests therein which might be adverse to the interest of the corporation, even though the vote of the director or directors having such adverse interest shall have been necessary to obligate the corporation upon such contact or obligation; provided, however, that in any such case, the fact of such interest shall be disclosed to the other directors or share holders acting upon or in reference to such contract or transaction.
