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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned incorporator to these Articles of Incorporation, hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida as follows:

ARTICLE I

NAME OF INCORPORATOR

The name of this corporation is MVP SALES, INC.

ARTICLE II

TERM OF EXISTENCE

The date when corporate existence shall commence shall be the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation by the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida and the corporation shall have perpetual existence thereafter.

ARTICLE III

GENERAL NATURE OF BUSINESS

This corporation is organized for the following purposes:

- A. Retail sales of motor vehicles and property; and
- B. To engage in any lawful business authorized under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE IV
