Chiropractor charged in bat attack on wife

Shortly, after dropping her kids off at school Oct. 12, Judith Anthony returned to her suburtran Boynton Beach home to find amasked man in her kitchen.

Wielding a baseball bat, the man repeatedly beat the 45 yearold woman in the head and right leg, planted cocaine in her pocket and left her after she pretended to be dead.

Anthony survived the attack, and on Friday, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's office arrested a man for the attack:

Joseph M. Anthony, 54 — her husband of 22 years and a local chiropractor who runs Palm, Beach Sports Medicine Associates on Boynton Beach Boule-

Anthony was in Palm Beach County Jail Friday night, with a court appearance scheduled for this morning. He is charged with aggravated battery, wearing a mask (stocking) while committing a felony, armed residential. She screamed "I have chil-burglary, grand auto theft and a dren, please don't do this," Nautrespassing on a construction

The couple are involved in an "acrimonious divorce," according

Anthony's wife lost conher Picot Court home and was flown by helicopter to Delray Medical Center, where she spent three days recovering, records show She is the owner of The Candle Cottage in downtown Eake Worth, said Detective Ulrich Naujoks. The couple has a 16-year-old son and a 7-year-old daughter.

Sheriff's investigators have not found the bat, Naujoks said. Judith Anthony had in the past requested a restraining order against her husband, Naujoks said, and a former girlfriend of Joseph Anthony's has an active stay-away order out against the chiropractor.

as a chiropractor in Florida Jan. 1, 1994. He has two ethics cases pending against him before the state Agency for Health Care Administration. Anthony has fabricated names on his office sign-in sheet "in order to make the patient load look fuller," according to the agency's 1998 administrative complaint. This year the agency charged Anthony with submitting false insurance claims.

In both cases, the state is seeking the state Board of Medicine to penalize Anthony accordingly, including possible revocation of his license.

According to arrest records: Judith Anthony had returned home at about 8:40 a.m. on Oct. 12. When she entered the kitchen, she was ambushed by a 6-foot, 1-inch tall man weighing 180 pounds and wearing a stocking over his head. The man said nothing while beating her in the head at least eight times. He also pummeled her leg.

joks wrote in the arrest records. Then she remained still pretending that she was dead.

There was no sign of forced entry at the house. The family dog was locked in the bedroom. Joseph Anthony was living in an

rental apartment at the time.

Detectives later found a
Tominy Hilliger shirt at a construction side. The shirt, believed to be worn by Joseph Anthony during the attack, contained blood stains as well as DNA material from Judith and Joseph Anthony, records show.

During the investigation, detectives obtained a sworn statement from a drug dealer who said he sold cocaine to Joseph Anthony. The dealer told detectives that the chiropractor told him he was buying the drugs to plant in his wife's office, car and home to discredit her his wife and have her arrested.
