ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

DISTINCTIVE DOMAIN, INC.

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation under the provisions of the Laws of the State of Florida, hereby make, subscribe and acknowledge before a Notary Public, and file with the Secretary of State of the State of Florida, the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the corporation is:

DISTINCTIVE DOMAIN, INC.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The general nature of the business to be conducted and carried on by this corporation is:

- (a) Interior Design .
- (b) To engage in every aspect and phase of each and every lawful business or operation permitted by the laws of the State of Florida, including, but not limited to, the rights and power to manufacture, distribute, purchase, or otherwise acquire, and to own, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of, and to invest in, trade in, deal in and with goods, wares, merchandise, real and personal property, and services of every class, kind and description; except that it is not to conduct a banking, safe deposit, trust, insurance, surety, express, railroad, canal, telephone, telegraph, or cemetery company, a

building and loan association, mutual fire insurance association, cooperative association, fraternal benefit society, state fair or exposition.

- (c) To purchase, take and lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, rights or privileges suitable or convenient for any purposes of this business, and to purchase, acquire, erect and construct, make improvements of buildings, or machinery, stores or works, insofar as the same may be appurtenant to or useful for the conduct of the business as above specified, but only to the extent to which the company may be authorized by the statutes under which it is organized.
- (d) To purchase, sell, pledge, subscribe for or otherwise acquire and to hold the shares, stocks, bonds, debentures, futures, options, commodities, puts and calls or obligations of any company organized under the laws of the State of Florida or of any other state or of any territory of the United States or of any foreign country, except monies or transportation, banking or insurance companies, and to sell or exchange the same, or upon the distribution of assets or divisions of profits, to distribute any such share, stocks, or obligations or proceeds thereof among the stockholders of this company.
- (e) The corporation shall have full power and lawful authority to issue, execute, assign and endorse notes, mortgages, bonds and all other negotiable papers; to secure any indebtedness due it in the same manner common to natural persons. It shall have

the full power to loan money and secure the payment thereof by accepting mortgages, personal endorsements or assignments of personal property or other security. It may sue or be sued, contract or be contracted with, and do any and all other acts necessary or incidental to the powers herein specifically designated.

- (f) To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description with any person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, county, state, body politic or government or colony or dependency thereof.
- (g) The foregoing shall be construed as independent businesses, and the enumeration of any specific business shall not restrict any other business of the corporation.
- (h) The corporation shall, in addition, have the power to carry on any other lawful business whatsoever in connection with the foregoing, which is calculated directly or indirectly to promote the interests of the corporation, or to enhance the value its assets.
- each, any and all of the acts and things above enumerated, and any and all other acts and things insofar as the same may be incidental to or included in any or all of the general powers given, always provided that the grant of the foregoing enumerated powers above enumerated shall be exercised by the acts above recited under which said company shall be exercised by the acts above recited under which it was organized. The said corporation may perform any part

of its business outside of the State of Florida, or in other states or colonies of the United States, or in any foreign country or countries.

ARTICLE III - DURATION

This corporation shall exist on a perpetual basis commencing on the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE IV - CAPITAL STOCK

- A. The aggregate number of shares that the corporation shall have the authority to issue is Five Hundred (_500_) Shares of Capital Stock with One Dollar (\$1.00) par value per share.
- B. The sum of the par value of all shares of Capital Stock of the corporation that have been issued shall be the states capital of the incorporation of any particular time.
- C. The holders of the outstanding capital stock shall be entitled to receive, when and as declared by the Board of Directors, dividends payable either in cash, in property, or in share of the capital stock of the corporation.
- D. The shares of the corporation are not to be divided into classes.
- E. The corporation is not authorized to issue share in series.

ARTICLE V - PRE-EMPTIVE RIGHTS

Every shareholder, upon the sale for cash of any new stock of this corporation of the same kind, class or series as that which he already holds, shall have the right to purchase his pro rata share thereof (as nearly as may be done without issuance of fractional shares) at the price which it is offered to others.

- B. Both stockholders and directors shall have the power, if the By-laws so provide, to hold their respective meetings, and to have one or more offices within the State of Florida or without, and to keep the books of the corporation (subject to the provisions

of the statutes) outside the State of Florida, at such places as may from time to time be designated by the Board of Directors.

C. The corporation may in its By-laws confer powers upon its Directors in addition to the foregoing and in addition to the powers authorized and expressly conferred by statute.
