#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

### COMMERCIAL PLASTERING & STUCCO, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming and organizing a corporation for profit under the provisions of the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

# **ARTICLE I - NAME**
