**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
ROBERT T. BROWN, P. A.**

The undersigned subscriber to these articles of incorporation, being duly licensed to practice law under the laws of the State of Florida, adopts these articles to form a professional association under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I – NAME

This corporation shall be known as Law Offices of Robert T. Brown, P. A.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The professional association is formed to engage in every phase and aspect of the practice of law. In addition, the corporation may invest the funds of the profession association in real estate, mortgages, stocks, bonds or any other type of investment, and own real and personal property necessary for the rendering of professional services.

ARTICLE III – TERM OF EXISTENCE

The term for which this corporation shall exist is to be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV – STOCK

The total number of shares of capital stock that may be issued by this corporation is 100 shares, each share having a nominal par value of \$1.00 per share, all of which shall be common stock and shall be fully paid and non assessable.

None of the shares of the professional association may be issued to anyone other than an individual duly licensed to practice law in the State of Florida.

ARTICLE V – ADDRESS OF BUSINESS

The initial address of the principal office of this corporation shall be:

The Board of Directors may from time to time move this principal office to any other address in the State of Florida.

ARTICLE VI – REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

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ARTICLE VII – INITIAL DIRECTORS

The corporation elects to become a small business concern under Subchapter S of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

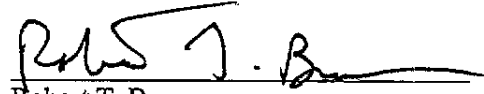
ARTICLE XI – POWERS

The shareholder(s) of the professional association shall have the power to include in the bylaws, adopted by a majority of the shareholders of the professional association, any regulatory or restrictive provisions regarding the proposed sale, transfer or other disposition of any of the outstanding stock of the professional association by any of its shareholders, or in the event of the death of any of its shareholders. The manner and form, as well as the relevant terms, conditions and details of the disposition shall be determined by the shareholder(s) of the professional association. No shareholder of the professional association may sell or transfer his stock in the corporation except to another individual who is eligible to be a shareholder of the professional association, and the sale or transfer may be made only after it has been approved at a shareholder meeting specially called for that purpose. If any shareholder becomes legally disqualified to practice law in the State of Florida or is elected to public office or accepts employment that places restrictions or limitation on his continuous rendering of such professional services, that shareholder's shares of stock shall immediately become subject to purchase by the professional association in accordance with the bylaws adopted by the shareholders.

ARTICLE XII – RESERVATIONS

The corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provisions in these Articles of Incorporation in the manner provided by law. Any right conferred on the shareholders is subject to this reservation.

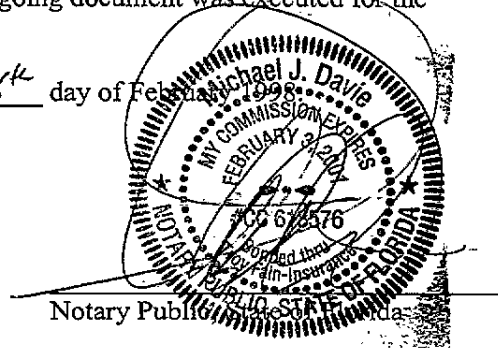
