ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF DAVID ALEXANDER JEWELERS, INC.

SECRETARY OF STATE TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

The undersigned Incorporator hereby forms a corporation under the laws of the State of Florida as provided herein.

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation to be formed is:

DAVID ALEXANDER JEWELERS, INC.

ARTICLE II TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation shall have perpetual existence, commencing upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation by the Department of State.

ARTICLE III NATURE OF BUSINESS

This corporation is organized for the following purposes:

- 1. To buy, sell, trade, manufacture, deal in and with, and carry on a jewelry business, whether as wholesaler, retailer, importer, or exporter; and to acquire all merchandise, supplies, materials, and other articles which may be necessary and proper to carry on such business.
- 2. To purchase, or in any way acquire for investment or for sale or otherwise, lands, contracts for the purchase or sale of lands, buildings, improvements, and any other real property of any kind or any interest therein, and as the consideration for same, to pay cash or to issue the capital stock, debenture bonds, mortgage bonds, or other obligations of the corporation; to make and obtain loans upon real estate, improved or unimproved, and upon personal property, giving or taking evidences of indebtedness and security for the payment thereof by mortgage, trust deed, pledge, or otherwise; to enter into contracts to buy or sell any property, real or personal; to buy or sell mortgages, trust deeds, pledges, contracts, and evidences of indebtedness; and to draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute, and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures, and other negotiable or transferrable instruments, or obligations of the corporation, from

time to time, for any of the objects and purposes for which this corporation is being formed without restriction or limit as to amount.

This corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provisions contained in these Articles of Incorporation, or any amendment hereto, in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE XI CONTRACTS
